A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of the Palliative Care Interdisciplinary Advisory Council. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that: (1) palliative 6 care is person-centered, 7 family-focused care that provides a patient with relief from the symptoms, pain, and stress of a serious illness; 8 9 (2) palliative care is provided by a team of physicians, nurses, and other health care specialists to ensure an 10 additional layer of support to a patient during the treatment of a 11 12 serious illness; 13 (3) palliative care is appropriate for a patient of 14 any age and at any stage of a serious illness; and (4) evidence shows that palliative care can reduce 15 16 medical costs in addition to helping a patient recover from a 17 serious illness more quickly and easily. 18 SECTION 2. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Chapter 118 to read as follows: 19 CHAPTER 118. PALLIATIVE CARE INTERDISCIPLINARY ADVISORY COUNCIL 20 Sec. 118.001. DEFINITION. In this chapter, "advisory 21 council" means the Palliative Care Interdisciplinary Advisory 22 23 Council established under this chapter. 24 Sec. 118.002. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The commission shall

No. 1874 1 establish the Palliative Care Interdisciplinary Advisory Council 2 to assess the availability of patient-centered and family-focused 3 palliative care in this state. 4 Sec. 118.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The advisory council is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset 5 Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter, 6 7 the advisory council is abolished and this chapter expires September 1, 2019. 8 Sec. 118.004. MEMBERS. (a) The advisory council is 9 10 composed of the members appointed by the executive commissioner as provided by this section. 11 12 (b) The advisory council must include: (1) at least five physician members, including two who 13 14 are board certified in hospice and palliative care and one who is 15 board certified in pain management; 16 (2) at least two advanced practice registered nurse 17 members who are board certified in hospice and palliative care; (3) five health care professional members, including 18 19 nurses, social workers, pharmacists, and spiritual care professionals, with: 20 21 (A) experience providing palliative care to 22 pediatric, youth, or adult populations; 23 (B) expertise in palliative care delivery in an 24 inpatient, outpatient, or community setting; or 25 (C) expertise in interdisciplinary palliative 26 care; 27 (4) at least three members with experience as an

1 advocate for patients and the patients' family caregivers and who are independent of a hospital or other health care facility, 2 including at least one member who is a representative of an 3 established patient advocacy organization; and 4 5 (5) ex officio representatives of the commission or another state agency as the executive commissioner determines 6 7 appropriate. 8 (c) Advisory council members serve at the pleasure of the executive commissioner. 9 10 Sec. 118.005. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) An advisory council member serves a four-year term. 11 12 (b) If a vacancy occurs on the advisory council, a person shall be appointed to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term. 13 Sec. 118.006. OFFICERS. Advisory council members shall: 14 15 (1) elect a chair and a vice chair; and 16 (2) establish the duties of the chair and the vice 17 chair. Sec. 118.007. MEETINGS. The executive commissioner shall 18 19 set a time and place for regular meetings, which must occur at least 20 twice each year. 21 Sec. 118.008. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of 22 the advisory council may not receive compensation for service on the advisory council but is entitled to reimbursement of the travel 23 24 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of the advisory council, as provided by the General Appropriations 25 26 Act. Sec. 118.009. DUTIES. The advisory council shall consult 27

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with and advise the commission on matters related to the 1 establishment, maintenance, operation, and outcome evaluation of 2 the palliative care consumer and professional information and 3 education program established under Section 118.011. 4 5 Sec. 118.010. REPORT. Not later than October 1 of each even-numbered year, the advisory council shall submit a biennial 6 7 report to the standing committees of the senate and the house of 8 representatives with primary jurisdiction over health matters on: (1) the advisory council's assessment of 9 the availability of palliative care in this state for patients in the 10 11 early stages of serious disease; and 12 (2) the advisory council's analysis of barriers to 13 greater access to palliative care. Sec. 118.011. INFORMATION AND EDUCATION PROGRAM. (a) The 14 15 commission, in consultation with the advisory council, shall establish a statewide palliative care consumer and professional 16 17 information and education program to ensure that comprehensive and accurate information and education about palliative care are 18 available to the public, health care providers, and health care 19 facilities. 20 21 (b) The commission shall make available on its Internet website information and resources regarding palliative care, 22 23 including: 24 (1) links to external resources regarding palliative 25 care; 26 (2) continuing education opportunities for health 27 care providers;

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1	(3) information about palliative care delivery in the
2	home, primary, secondary, and tertiary environments; and
3	(4) consumer educational materials regarding
4	palliative care, including hospice care.
5	Sec. 118.012. PROTECTIONS. Notwithstanding any other law,
6	the advisory council and the information and education program
7	established under this chapter do not create a cause of action or
8	create a standard of care, obligation, or duty that provides a basis
9	for a cause of action.

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10 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2015, the Health and 11 Human Services Commission shall establish the Palliative Care 12 Interdisciplinary Advisory Council and the executive commissioner 13 of the Health and Human Services Commission shall appoint the 14 advisory council members as required by Chapter 118, Health and 15 Safety Code, as added by this Act.

16 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
