## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	the	establishment	of	the	Palliative	Care

- 2 relating to the establishment of the ralliative car
- 3 Interdisciplinary Advisory Council.

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- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that:
- 6 (1) palliative care is person-centered,
- 7 family-focused care that provides a patient with relief from the
- 8 symptoms, pain, and stress of a serious illness;
- 9 (2) palliative care is provided by a team of
- 10 physicians, nurses, and other health care specialists in order to
- 11 provide an additional layer of support to a patient during the
- 12 treatment of a serious illness;
- 13 (3) palliative care is appropriate for a patient of
- 14 any age and at any stage of a serious illness; and
- 15 (4) growing evidence shows that palliative care can
- 16 reduce medical costs in addition to helping a patient recover from a
- 17 serious illness more quickly and easily.
- 18 SECTION 2. Subtitle E, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Chapter 118 to read as follows:
- 20 CHAPTER 118. PALLIATIVE CARE INTERDISCIPLINARY ADVISORY COUNCIL
- Sec. 118.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
- (1) "Advisory council" means the Palliative Care
- 23 Interdisciplinary Advisory Council established under this chapter.
- 24 (2) "Commission" means the Health and Human Services

- 1 <u>Commission</u>.
- 2 (3) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
- 3 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
- 4 Sec. 118.002. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSE. The commission shall
- 5 establish the Palliative Care Interdisciplinary Advisory Council
- 6 to assess the availability of patient-centered and family-focused
- 7 palliative care in this state.
- 8 Sec. 118.003. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT. The advisory
- 9 council is subject to Chapter 325, Government Code (Texas Sunset
- 10 Act). Unless continued in existence as provided by that chapter,
- 11 the advisory council is abolished and this chapter expires
- 12 September 1, 2019.
- Sec. 118.004. MEMBERS. (a) The advisory council is
- 14 composed of the members appointed by the executive commissioner as
- 15 provided by this section.
- 16 (b) The advisory council must include:
- 17 (1) at least five physician members, including two who
- 18 are board certified in hospice and palliative care;
- 19 (2) at least two advanced practice registered nurse
- 20 members who are board certified in hospice and palliative care;
- 21 (3) seven health care professional members, including
- 22 nurses, social workers, pharmacists, and spiritual care
- 23 professionals, with:
- 24 (A) experience providing palliative care to
- 25 pediatric, youth, or adult populations;
- 26 (B) expertise in palliative care delivery in an
- 27 inpatient, outpatient, or community setting; or

- 1 (C) expertise in interdisciplinary palliative
- 2 care;
- 3 (4) at least one member with experience as an advocate
- 4 for patients and family caregivers; and
- 5 (5) ex officio representatives of the commission or
- 6 <u>another state agency as the executive commissioner determines</u>
- 7 <u>appropriate</u>.
- 8 (c) Advisory council members serve at the pleasure of the
- 9 executive commissioner.
- Sec. 118.005. TERMS; VACANCY. (a) An advisory council
- 11 member serves a four-year term.
- 12 (b) If a vacancy occurs on the advisory council, a person
- 13 shall be appointed to fill the vacancy for the unexpired term.
- 14 Sec. 118.006. OFFICERS. Advisory council members shall:
- 15 (1) elect a chair and a vice chair; and
- 16 (2) establish the duties of the chair and the vice
- 17 chair.
- 18 Sec. 118.007. MEETINGS. The executive commissioner shall
- 19 set a time and place for regular meetings, which must occur at least
- 20 twice each year.
- Sec. 118.008. COMPENSATION AND REIMBURSEMENT. A member of
- 22 the advisory council may not receive compensation for service on
- 23 the advisory council but is entitled to reimbursement of the travel
- 24 expenses incurred by the member while conducting the business of
- 25 the advisory council, as provided by the General Appropriations
- 26 Act.
- Sec. 118.009. DUTIES. The advisory council shall consult

- 1 with and advise the commission on matters related to the
- 2 establishment, maintenance, operation, and outcome evaluation of
- 3 the palliative care consumer and professional information and
- 4 education program established under Section 118.011.
- 5 Sec. 118.010. REPORT. Not later than October 1 of each
- 6 even-numbered year, the advisory council shall submit a biennial
- 7 report to the standing committees of the senate and the house of
- 8 representatives with primary jurisdiction over health matters on:
- 9 (1) the advisory council's assessment of the
- 10 availability of palliative care in this state for patients in the
- 11 early stages of serious disease; and
- 12 (2) the advisory council's analysis of barriers to
- 13 greater access to palliative care.
- 14 Sec. 118.011. INFORMATION AND EDUCATION PROGRAM. (a) The
- 15 commission, in consultation with the advisory council, shall
- 16 <u>establish a statewide palliative care consumer and professional</u>
- 17 information and education program to ensure that comprehensive and
- 18 accurate information and education about palliative care is
- 19 available to the public, health care providers, and health care
- 20 facilities.
- 21 (b) The commission shall make available on its Internet
- 22 website information and resources regarding palliative care,
- 23 including:
- 24 (1) links to external resources regarding palliative
- 25 care;
- 26 (2) continuing education opportunities for health
- 27 care providers;

- 1 (3) information about palliative care delivery in the
- 2 home, primary, secondary, and tertiary environments; and
- 3 (4) consumer educational materials regarding
- 4 palliative care, including hospice care.
- 5 Sec. 118.012. PROTECTIONS. Notwithstanding any other law,
- 6 this chapter does not create a cause of action or create a standard
- 7 of care, obligation, or duty that provides a basis for a cause of
- 8 action.
- 9 SECTION 3. Not later than December 1, 2015, the Health and
- 10 Human Services Commission shall establish the Palliative Care
- 11 Interdisciplinary Advisory Council and the executive commissioner
- 12 of the Health and Human Services Commission shall appoint the
- 13 advisory council members as required by Chapter 118, Health and
- 14 Safety Code, as added by this Act.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 16 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 17 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 18 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 19 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
