## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to the reimbursement of providers under the Medicaid program for the provision of telemedicine medical services in a 3 school-based setting. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Section 531.0217, Government Code, is amended by 6 7 adding Subsection (c-4) and amending Subsection (g) to read as 8 follows: 9 (c-4) The commission shall ensure that Medicaid reimbursement is provided to a physician for a telemedicine medical 10 service provided by the physician, even if the physician is not the 11 patient's primary care physician or provider, if: 12 (1) the physician is an authorized health care 13 14 provider under the Medicaid program; (2) the patient is a child who receives the service in 15 16 a primary or secondary school-based setting; and 17 (3) a health professional is present with the patient during the treatment. 18 (g) If a patient receiving a telemedicine medical service 19 has a primary care physician or provider and consents or, if 20 appropriate, the patient's parent or legal guardian consents to the 21 notification, the commission <u>may</u> [shall] require that the primary 22

23 care physician or provider be notified of the telemedicine medical 24 service for the purpose of sharing medical information. In the case

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1 of a service provided to a child in a school-based setting as 2 described by Subsection (c-4), the notification, if any, must 3 include a summary of the service, including exam findings, 4 prescribed or administered medications, and patient instructions.

5 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act 6 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a 7 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision, 8 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or 9 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the 10 waiver or authorization is granted.

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SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
