- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 151.003, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 5 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 151.003. QUALIFICATIONS OF JUDGE. The special judge
- 7 must be a retired or former district court, statutory county court,
- 8 statutory probate court, or appellate court judge who:
- 9 (1) has served as a judge for at least four years in a
- 10 district court, statutory county court, statutory probate court, or
- 11 appellate court;
- 12 (2) has developed substantial experience in the
- 13 judge's [his] area of specialty;
- 14 (3) has not been removed from office or resigned while
- 15 under investigation for discipline or removal; and
- 16 (4) annually demonstrates <u>completion</u> [that he has
- 17  $\frac{\text{completed}}{\text{completed}}$  in the past calendar year  $\frac{\text{of}}{\text{of}}$  at least five days of
- 18 continuing legal education in courses approved by the state bar or
- 19 the supreme court.
- 20 SECTION 2. This Act applies only to a referral of a case to a
- 21 special judge under Chapter 151, Civil Practice and Remedies Code,
- 22 made on or after the effective date of this Act. A referral made
- 23 before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 24 applicable to the referral immediately before the effective date of

- 1 this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
