- 4 SECTION 1. Section 41.102, Agriculture Code, is amended to

- 6 Sec. 41.102. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE. In
- 7 addition to other remedies provided by law, a violation of any
- 8 provision of Subchapters B-E or H [of this chapter] is grounds for
- 9 suspension or revocation of any license or permit issued by the
- 10 commissioner. The suspension or revocation shall be conducted in
- 11 accordance with the procedures provided by law for suspension or
- 12 revocation on the basis of other grounds.
- 13 SECTION 2. Subchapter H, Chapter 41, Agriculture Code, is
- 14 amended by adding Section 41.1565 to read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 41.1565. MEETINGS BY TELEPHONE CONFERENCE CALL. (a)
- 16 Notwithstanding Chapter 551, Government Code, the council or a
- 17 committee established by the council may hold an open or closed
- 18 meeting by telephone conference call if the convening at one
- 19 <u>location of a quorum of the council or committee is inconvenient for</u>
- 20 any member of the council or committee.
- 21 (b) The meeting is subject to the notice requirements

- 23 <u>(c) The notice of the meeting must specify as the location</u>

- 2 (d) Each part of the meeting that is required to be open to
- 3 the public shall be audible to the public at the location specified
- 4 <u>in the notice of the meeting as the location of the meeting and the</u>
- 5 <u>audio shall be recorded. The audio recording shall be made</u>
- 6 available to the public.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act to Section
- 8 41.102, Agriculture Code, applies only to conduct that occurs on or
- 9 after the effective date of this Act. Conduct that occurs before the
- 10 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the
- 11 date the conduct occurs, and the former law is continued in effect
- 12 for that purpose.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
