## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT 2 relating to the aerospace and aviation office of the Texas Economic 3 Development and Tourism Office and to the aerospace and aviation 4 advisory committee. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. Section 481.0066, Government Code, is amended by

7 amending Subsections (d) and (e) and adding Subsections (d-1), 8 (d-2), (e-1), and (e-2) to read as follows:

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(d) The aerospace and aviation office shall:

10 (1) analyze space-related and aviation-related 11 research currently conducted in this state and may conduct 12 activities designed to further that research;

13 (2) analyze the state's economic position in the14 aerospace and aviation industries;

(3) develop short-term and long-term business strategies as part of an industry-specific strategic plan to promote the retention, development, and expansion of aerospace and aviation industry facilities in the state that is consistent with and complementary of the office strategic plan;

20 (4) make specific recommendations to the legislature21 and the governor regarding the promotion of those industries;

(5) <u>as part of and to further the purposes of the</u>
 <u>industry-specific strategic plan described by Subdivision (3)</u>,
 <u>develop short-term and long-term policy initiatives or recommend</u>

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C.S.H.B. No. 1984 1 reforms the state may undertake or implement to: 2 (A) increase investment in aerospace and 3 aviation activities; 4 (B) support the retention, development, and 5 expansion of spaceports in this state; 6 (C) identify and encourage educational, 7 economic, and defense-related opportunities for aerospace and aviation activities; 8 (D) increase funding for the spaceport trust fund 9 10 created under Section 481.0069 and support ongoing projects that have been assisted by the fund, including recommending to the 11 12 legislature an appropriate funding level for the fund; (E) partner with the Texas Higher Education 13 Coordinating Board to foster technological advancement and 14 15 economic development for spaceport activities by strengthening 16 higher education programs and supporting aerospace activities; and 17 (F) partner with the Texas Workforce Commission to support initiatives that address the high-technology skills and 18 19 staff resources needed to better promote the state's efforts in becoming the leading space exploration state in the nation; 20 21 (6) act as a liaison with other state and federal entities with related economic, educational, and 2.2 defense 23 responsibilities to support the marketing of the state's aerospace 24 and aviation capabilities; 25 (7) [(6)] provide technical support and expertise to

26 the state and to local spaceport authorities regarding aerospace 27 and aviation business matters; and

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1 (8) [(7)] be responsible for the promotion and 2 development of spaceports in this state.

3 (d-1) The aerospace and aviation office shall make specific short-term and long-term statutory, administrative, 4 and 5 budget-related recommendations to the legislature and the governor regarding the policy initiatives and reforms described by 6 Subsection (d)(5) that may be implemented by the state. The 7 8 short-term recommendations must include a plan for state action for implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2017. The 9 initiatives and reforms in the short-term plan must be fully 10 implemented by September 1, 2020. The long-term recommendations 11 12 must include a plan for state action for implementation beginning not later than September 1, 2020. The initiatives and reforms in 13 14 the long-term plan must be fully implemented by September 1, 2025. 15 The aerospace and aviation office shall submit these recommendations to the legislature and governor with the biennial 16 17 report required by Subsection (d-2) not later than December 1, 2016. This subsection expires September 1, 2017. 18

19 (d-2) Not later than December 1 of each even-numbered year, the aerospace and aviation office shall submit to the legislature 20 and governor, in printed or electronic form, a report detailing the 21 actions taken by the aerospace and aviation office in carrying out 22 the policy initiatives and reforms under Subsection (d)(5) to 23 24 further the purposes of the industry-specific strategic plan as specified in the recommendations required by Subsection (d-1), 25 26 including:

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(1) the status of all projects and activities;

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1	(2) the funding of expenditures;
2	(3) a summary of work performed as part of the
3	aerospace and aviation office's partnership with the Texas Higher
4	Education Coordinating Board, including a summary prepared by the
5	board of the research conducted by public senior colleges or
6	universities, as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code;
7	(4) a summary of work performed as part of the
8	aerospace and aviation office's partnership with the Texas
9	Workforce Commission; and
10	(5) an explanation of the ways in which the aerospace
11	and aviation office has promoted the state's economic development
12	goals through increased space exploration activities.
13	(e) The governor shall appoint an aerospace and aviation
14	advisory committee consisting of <u>:</u>
15	(1) seven qualified members to assist in the state's
16	economic development efforts to recruit and retain aerospace and
17	aviation jobs and investment; and
18	(2) one member for each active spaceport development
19	corporation in the state who represents the interests of each
20	respective spaceport development corporation.
21	(e-1) The aerospace and aviation advisory committee shall:
22	(1) advise the governor on the recruitment and
23	retention of aerospace and aviation jobs and investment <u>;</u>
24	(2) assist the office and the aerospace and aviation
25	office in meeting the state's economic development efforts to
26	recruit and retain aerospace and aviation jobs and investment;
27	(3) advise the office, the aerospace and aviation

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1 <u>office, and the governor on an appropriate funding level for the</u> 2 <u>spaceport trust fund;</u> 3 <u>(4) advise the office, the aerospace and aviation</u>

4 office, and the governor on recruitment, retention, and expansion 5 of aerospace and aviation industry activities; and

6 (5) collect and disseminate information on federal,
7 state, local, and private community economic development programs
8 that assist or provide loans, grants, or other funding to aerospace
9 and aviation industry activities.

10 <u>(e-2)</u> Members of the <u>aerospace and aviation advisory</u> 11 committee:

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(1) shall serve staggered four-year terms; and

13 (2) may not receive compensation for serving on the 14 committee.

15 SECTION 2. (a) The terms of the current members of the 16 aerospace and aviation advisory committee expire on the effective 17 date of this Act. On that date or as soon as possible after that 18 date, the governor shall appoint new members to the aerospace and 19 aviation advisory committee in accordance with the requirements of 20 Section 481.0066(e), Government Code, as amended by this Act.

(b) A member of the aerospace and aviation advisory committee serving immediately before the effective date of this Act is eligible for reappointment to the committee if the person has the qualifications for a member under Section 481.0066(e), Government Code, as amended by this Act.

26 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
