5	SECTION 1. Chapter 82, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 82.0045 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 82.0045. LIABILITY FOR MISUSE. (a) In this section,
8	"misuse" means the use of a product in a manner other than the
9	product's intended use. Misuse includes a use:
10	(1) inconsistent with the specifications and
11	standards applicable to the product;
1 2	(2) contrary to an instruction or warning provided by

- 12 (2) contrary to an instruction or warning provided by
- the manufacturer, seller, or other person possessing knowledge or 13
- 14 training regarding the use or maintenance of the product; or
- (3) determined to be improper by a federal or state 15
- 16 agency charged with protecting consumer or product safety.
- (b) In a products liability action, a manufacturer or seller 17
- shall not be liable for any claim arising out of harm caused by 18
- 19 misuse of a product by a person other than the manufacturer or
- 20 seller.
- 21 (c) On its own motion and after reasonable notice to the
- 22 parties, the court shall dismiss a claim filed after September 1,
- 23 2015, if the court finds by a preponderance of the evidence that the
- claim was caused by misuse of a product by a person other than the 24

1 manufacturer or seller.

- 2 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to an
- 3 action filed on or after the effective date of this Act. An action
- 4 filed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 5 in effect on the date the action was filed, and that law is
- 6 continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
