A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the authority to modify an ad valorem tax abatement
- 3 agreement to extend the abatement period if a disaster prevents the
- 4 property owner from complying with the agreement.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 312.208, Tax Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (a) At any time before the expiration of an agreement made
- 10 under this subchapter, the agreement may be modified by the parties
- 11 to the agreement to include other provisions that could have been
- 12 included in the original agreement or to delete provisions that
- 13 were not necessary to the original agreement. The modification must
- 14 be made by the same procedure by which the original agreement was
- 15 approved and executed. Except as provided by Subsection (c), the
- 16 [The] original agreement may not be modified to extend beyond 10
- 17 years from the date of the original agreement.
- 18 <u>(c)</u> The parties to an agreement made under this subchapter
- 19 may modify the agreement to extend the abatement period for a period
- 20 not to exceed 10 years from the date the modified agreement is
- 21 executed if:
- 22 (1) the area in which the property that is the subject
- 23 of the agreement is located is declared to be a disaster area by the
- 24 governor;

- 1 (2) the owner of the property sustains a casualty loss
- 2 to the property as a result of the disaster; and
- 3 (3) the casualty loss prevents the owner of the
- 4 property from complying with the original agreement.
- 5 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies to the
- 6 modification of an ad valorem tax abatement agreement regardless of
- 7 whether the disaster prompting the modification of the agreement
- 8 occurred before, on, or after the effective date of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
