A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to requiring direct access to 9-1-1 service from certain
3	telephone systems and Internet Protocol services.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as Kari's Law.
6	SECTION 2. Subtitle B, Title 9, Health and Safety Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 771A to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 771A. ACCESS TO EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS SERVICES IN
9	GENERAL
10	Sec. 771A.001. DIRECT ACCESS TO 9-1-1 SERVICE REQUIRED. (a)
11	<pre>In this chapter:</pre>
12	(1) "Business service user" means a user of business
13	service that provides telecommunications service, including 9-1-1
14	service, to end users through a publicly or privately owned
15	telephone switch.
16	(2) "Commission" means the Commission on State
17	Emergency Communications.
18	(3) "Emergency communication district" means:
19	(A) a public agency or group of public agencies
20	acting jointly that provided 9-1-1 service before September 1,
21	1987, or that had voted or contracted before that date to provide
22	that service; or
23	(B) a district created under Subchapter B, C, D,

24 <u>F, or G, Chapter 772.</u>

- 1 (4) "Internet Protocol enabled service" has the
- 2 meaning assigned by Section 51.002, Utilities Code.
- 3 (5) "Telephone system" includes a multiline telephone
- 4 system.
- 5 (b) This section applies to the extent the section is not
- 6 inconsistent with or preempted by federal law.
- 7 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, a business service user
- 8 that provides residential or business facilities, owns or leases a
- 9 telephone system or an equivalent system that uses Internet
- 10 Protocol enabled service, and provides outbound dialing capacity or
- 11 access shall configure the system to allow a person initiating a
- 12 9-1-1 call on the system to access 9-1-1 service by dialing the
- 13 digits 9-1-1 without an additional code, digit, prefix, postfix, or
- 14 trunk-access code.
- 15 (d) The commission may adopt rules to implement this section
- 16 for areas that are governed by a regional plan, and an emergency
- 17 communication district may adopt those rules in accordance with
- 18 Section 771.062.
- 19 (e) On the request of the business service user, the
- 20 commission, an emergency communication district, or a home-rule
- 21 municipality that independently operates a 9-1-1 system shall
- 22 provide assistance to a business service user that is within the
- 23 applicable governmental entity's jurisdiction in complying with
- 24 this section.
- Sec. 771A.002. 9-1-1 ADDRESS INFORMATION FOR CERTAIN
- 26 BUSINESS SERVICE USERS. A business service user described by
- 27 Section 771A.001(c) must furnish 9-1-1 address information for each

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- 1 line of the multiline telephone system to the applicable
- 2 governmental entity that operates a 9-1-1 system. The 9-1-1
- 3 address information must indicate the room number or similar
- 4 designation of a portion of the structure or building for each line
- 5 of the multiline telephone system.
- 6 SECTION 3. A business service user, as defined by Section
- 7 771A.001(a), Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, shall
- 8 comply with Sections 771A.001 and 771A.002, Health and Safety Code,
- 9 as added by this Act, not later than September 1, 2016.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
