4	SECTION 1. Section 402.009, Government Code, is amended to
5	read as follows:
6	Sec. 402.009. AUTHORITY TO EMPLOY AND COMMISSION PEACE
7	OFFICERS. (a) The attorney general may employ and commission peace
8	officers as investigators for the limited purpose of assisting the
9	attorney general in carrying out the duties of that office relating
10	to prosecution assistance and crime prevention.
11	(b) The attorney general shall ensure that a commissioned
12	peace officer employed as authorized under Subsection (a) is
13	compensated according to Schedule C of the position classification
14	salary schedule prescribed by the General Appropriations Act.
15	SECTION 2. Section 659.301(5), Government Code, is amended
16	to read as follows:
17	(5) "State employee" means an individual who:
18	(A) is a commissioned law enforcement officer of
19	the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Facilities Commission,
20	the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission, [or] the Texas Department
21	of Criminal Justice, or the attorney general;
22	(B) is a commissioned security officer of the
23	comptroller;
24	(C) is a law enforcement officer commissioned by

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1 the Parks and Wildlife Commission;

2 (D) is a commissioned peace officer of an3 institution of higher education;

(E) is an employee or official of the Board of
Pardons and Paroles or the parole division of the Texas Department
of Criminal Justice if the employee or official has routine direct
contact with inmates of any penal or correctional institution or
with administratively released prisoners subject to the board's
jurisdiction;

(F) 10 has been certified to the Employees Retirement System of Texas under Section 815.505 as having begun 11 employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial officer, 12 unless the individual has been certified to the system as having 13 14 ceased employment as a law enforcement officer or custodial 15 officer; or

(G) before May 29, 1987, received hazardous duty
pay based on the terms of any state law if the individual holds a
position designated under that law as eligible for the pay.

SECTION 3. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) This section applies to a peace officer under Article
22 2.12, Code of Criminal Procedure, who is commissioned as a law
23 enforcement officer or agent, including a ranger, by:

(1) the Public Safety Commission and the director ofthe Department of Public Safety;

26 (2) the Parks and Wildlife Commission; [or]
27 (3) the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Commission; or

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(4) the attorney general.

2 SECTION 4. (a) The classification officer in the office of 3 the state auditor shall classify the position of commissioned peace 4 officer employed as an investigator by the Office of the Attorney 5 General as a Schedule C position under the Texas Position 6 Classification Plan, 1961.

7 (b) The change made by the classification officer as 8 required by this section applies beginning in the state fiscal 9 biennium beginning September 1, 2015.

10 (c) This section expires September 1, 2017.

11 SECTION 5. Section 661.918(a), Government Code, as amended 12 by this Act, applies only to an injury that occurs on or after the 13 effective date of this Act.

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
