A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the expiration date of a driver's license, personal
- 3 identification certificate, commercial driver's license, or
- 4 commercial driver learner's permit issued to a sex offender;
- 5 increasing a fee.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Article 42.016, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 Art. 42.016. SPECIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION
- 10 REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN SEX OFFENDERS. If a person is convicted
- 11 of, receives a grant of deferred adjudication for, or is
- 12 adjudicated as having engaged in delinquent conduct based on a
- 13 violation of an offense for which a conviction or adjudication
- 14 requires registration as a sex offender under Chapter 62, the court
- 15 shall:
- 16 (1) issue an order requiring the Texas Department of
- 17 Public Safety to include in any driver's license record or personal
- 18 identification certificate record maintained by the department for
- 19 the person an indication that the person is subject to the
- 20 registration requirements of Chapter 62;
- 21 (2) require the person to apply to the Texas
- 22 Department of Public Safety in person for an original or renewal
- 23 driver's license or personal identification certificate not later
- 24 than the 30th day after the date the person is released or the date

- 1 the department sends written notice to the person of the
- 2 requirements of Article 62.060, as applicable, and to [annually]
- 3 renew the license or certificate according to the timeline provided
- 4 by Section 521.272, Transportation Code;
- 5 (3) notify the person of the consequence of the
- 6 conviction or order of deferred adjudication as it relates to the
- 7 order issued under this article; and
- 8 (4) send to the Texas Department of Public Safety a
- 9 copy of the record of conviction, a copy of the order granting
- 10 deferred adjudication, or a copy of the juvenile adjudication, as
- 11 applicable, and a copy of the order issued under this article.
- 12 SECTION 2. The heading to Section 521.103, Transportation
- 13 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 14 Sec. 521.103. EXPIRATION [AND RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS] FOR
- 15 CERTAIN SEX OFFENDERS.
- SECTION 3. Sections 521.103(a) and (b), Transportation
- 17 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 18 (a) The department may issue an original or renewal personal
- 19 identification certificate to a person whose driver's license or
- 20 personal identification certificate record indicates that the
- 21 person is subject to the registration requirements of Chapter 62,
- 22 Code of Criminal Procedure, only if the person:
- 23 (1) applies in person for the issuance of a
- 24 certificate under this section; and
- 25 (2) pays a fee of \$80 [\$20].
- 26 (b) A personal identification certificate issued under this
- 27 section, including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected certificate,

- 1 expires on the <u>fourth</u> [<u>first</u>] birthday of the certificate holder
- 2 occurring after the date of application[, except that the initial
- 3 certificate issued under this section expires on the second
- 4 birthday of the certificate holder occurring after the date of
- 5 application].
- 6 SECTION 4. The heading to Section 521.272, Transportation
- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 521.272. [RENEWAL OF] LICENSE ISSUED TO CERTAIN SEX
- 9 OFFENDERS.
- 10 SECTION 5. Section 521.272(c), Transportation Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (c) Notwithstanding Sections 521.271 and 521.2711, a
- 13 driver's license issued under this section, including a renewal,
- 14 duplicate, or corrected license, expires:
- 15 (1) if the license holder is a citizen, national, or
- 16 legal permanent resident of the United States or a refugee or asylee
- 17 lawfully admitted into the United States, on the fourth [first]
- 18 birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of
- 19 application[, except that the initial license issued under this
- 20 section expires on the second birthday of the license holder
- 21 occurring after the date of application]; or
- 22 (2) if the applicant is not described by Subdivision
- 23 (1), on the earlier of:
- 24 (A) the expiration date of the applicant's
- 25 authorized stay in the United States; or
- 26 (B) the fourth [first] birthday of the license
- 27 holder occurring after the date of application[, except that the

- 1 initial license issued under this section expires on the second
- 2 birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of
- 3 application].
- 4 SECTION 6. Section 521.421(h), Transportation Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (h) The fee for issuance or renewal of a driver's license, a
- 7 provisional license, an instruction permit, or a hardship license
- 8 issued to a person subject to the registration requirements under
- 9 Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure, is \$80 [\$20].
- SECTION 7. Section 522.033, Transportation Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 522.033. COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSE ISSUED TO CERTAIN
- 13 SEX OFFENDERS. (a) The department may issue an original or renewal
- 14 commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit
- 15 to a person whose driver's license or personal identification
- 16 certificate record indicates that the person is subject to the
- 17 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal
- 18 Procedure, only if the person is otherwise eligible for the
- 19 commercial driver's license or commercial driver learner's permit
- 20 and:
- 21 (1) applies in person for the issuance of a license or
- 22 permit under this section; and
- 23 (2) pays a fee of \$80 [\$20].
- 24 (b) Notwithstanding Section 522.051, a commercial driver's
- 25 license or commercial driver learner's permit issued under this
- 26 section, including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected license,
- 27 expires:

- 1 (1) if the license or permit holder is a citizen,
- 2 national, or legal permanent resident of the United States or a
- 3 refugee or asylee lawfully admitted into the United States, on the
- 4 fourth [first] birthday of the license holder occurring after the
- 5 date of application[, except that the initial license issued under
- 6 this section expires on the second birthday of the license holder
- 7 occurring after the date of application]; or
- 8 (2) if the applicant is not described by Subdivision
- 9 (1), on the earlier of:
- 10 (A) the expiration date of the applicant's
- 11 authorized stay in the United States; or
- 12 (B) the fourth [first] birthday of the license
- 13 holder occurring after the date of application[, except that the
- 14 initial license issued under this section expires on the second
- 15 birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of
- 16 application].
- SECTION 8. Article 62.060(b), Code of Criminal Procedure,
- 18 is repealed.
- 19 SECTION 9. The changes in law made by this Act to Sections
- 20 521.103, 521.272, 521.421, and 522.033, Transportation Code, apply
- 21 only to a driver's license, personal identification certificate,
- 22 commercial driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit
- 23 issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 24 driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial
- 25 driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit issued or
- 26 renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 27 in effect when the license, certificate, or permit was issued, and

- 1 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 2 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
