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	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of a sentinel surveillance program
3	for emerging and neglected tropical diseases.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subtitle D, Title 2, Health and Safety Code, is
6	amended by adding Chapter 100 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 100. EMERGING AND NEGLECTED TROPICAL DISEASES
8	Sec. 100.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
9	(1) "Department" means the Department of State Health
10	Services.
11	(2) "Emerging disease" means a disease that is
12	appearing in a specific population for the first time or that is
13	increasing in incidence or geographic range.
14	(3) "Executive commissioner" means the executive
15	commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission.
16	(4) "Health facility" includes:
17	(A) a general or special hospital licensed by the
18	department under Chapter 241;
19	(B) a physician-owned or physician-operated
20	<u>clinic;</u>
21	(C) a publicly or privately funded medical
22	<pre>school;</pre>
23	(D) a state hospital or state school maintained
24	and managed by the department or the Department of Aging and

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1 Disability Services; 2 (E) a public health clinic conducted by a local 3 health unit, health department, or public health district organized and recognized under Chapter 121; and 4 5 (F) another facility specified by a rule adopted by the executive commissioner. 6 7 (5) "Local health unit" has the meaning assigned by 8 Section 121.004. 9 (6) "Neglected tropical disease" means a parasitic or 10 bacterial disease that: (A) occurs solely or principally in the tropics; 11 12 (B) is largely endemic in the developing world; 13 and 14 (C) has a potential to spread through 15 international travel or trade. Sec. 100.002. CONFIDENTIALITY. (a) Except as specifically 16 17 authorized by this chapter, reports, records, and information furnished to a department employee or to an authorized agent of the 18 19 department that relate to cases or suspected cases of a health 20 condition are confidential and may be used only for the purposes of this chapter. 21 22 (b) Reports, records, and information relating to cases or suspected cases of health conditions in the possession of the 23 24 department under this chapter are not public information under Chapter 552, Government Code, and may not be released or made public 25 26 on subpoena or otherwise except as provided by this chapter. 27 (c) The department shall release medical, epidemiological,

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1 or toxicological information: 2 (1) to medical personnel, appropriate state agencies, health authorities, regional directors, and public officers of 3 counties and municipalities as necessary to comply with this 4 5 chapter and rules relating to the identification, monitoring, and referral of individuals infected with an emerging or neglected 6 7 tropical disease; or 8 (2) to appropriate federal agencies, such as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the United States 9 10 Public Health Service. (d) The department may release medical, epidemiological, or 11 12 toxicological information for statistical purposes, if released in 13 a manner that prevents the identification of any person. Sec. 100.003. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. A health 14 15 professional, a health facility, or an administrator, officer, or employee of a health facility subject to this chapter is not civilly 16 17 or criminally liable for divulging information required to be released under this chapter, except in a case of gross negligence or 18 19 wilful misconduct. Sec. 100.004. COOPERATION OF GOVERNMENTAL ENTITIES. 20 Another state board, commission, agency, or governmental entity 21 22 capable of assisting the department in carrying out the intent of this chapter shall cooperate with the department and furnish 23 24 expertise, services, and facilities to the program. Sec. 100.005. SENTINEL SURVEILLANCE PROGRAM. (a) 25 The 26 executive commissioner shall establish in the department a program 27 to:

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(1) identify by sentinel surveillance individuals 1 2 infected with emerging or neglected tropical diseases; 3 (2) maintain a central database of laboratory-confirmed cases of emerging and neglected tropical 4 5 diseases; and (3) use the information in the database to investigate 6 7 the incidence, prevalence, and trends of emerging and neglected 8 tropical diseases. 9 (b) In establishing the sentinel surveillance program for 10 emerging and neglected tropical diseases, the executive commissioner shall consider: 11 (1) the location of health facilities that collect 12 locally emerging and neglected tropical disease information; and 13 (2) the use, privacy, and security of existing data 14 15 collected by health facilities. 16 (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to govern 17 the operation of the program and carry out the intent of this chapter, including rules that: 18 19 (1) specify a system for selecting the demographic areas in which the department collects information; and 20 21 (2) identify the specific emerging and neglected tropical diseases that are included in the sentinel surveillance 22 program and the manner in which diseases will be added to the 23 24 program as necessary to reflect changing conditions. Sec. 100.006. DATA COLLECTION. (a) To ensure an accurate 25 26 source of data, the executive commissioner may require a health facility or health professional to make available for review by the 27

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1	department or by an authorized agent medical records or other
2	information in the facility's or professional's custody or control
3	that relates to an occurrence of an emerging or neglected tropical
4	disease.
5	(b) The department shall reimburse a health facility or
6	health professional for the actual costs incurred by the facility
7	or professional in making copies of medical records or other
8	information available to the department.
9	(c) The executive commissioner by rule shall prescribe the
10	manner in which information is reported to the department.
11	Sec. 100.007. DATABASE. (a) Information collected and
12	analyzed by the department or an authorized agent under this
13	chapter may be placed in a central database to facilitate
14	information sharing and provider education.
15	(b) The department may use the database to:
16	(1) design and evaluate measures to prevent the
17	occurrence of emerging and neglected tropical diseases and other
18	health conditions; and
19	(2) provide information and education to providers on
20	the incidence of emerging and neglected tropical diseases.
21	Sec. 100.008. EDUCATIONAL AND INFORMATIONAL MATERIALS. The
22	department shall make available to health facilities and health
23	professionals:
24	(1) educational and informational materials
25	concerning emerging and neglected tropical diseases; and
26	(2) information on the importance of monitoring and
27	surveilling emerging and neglected tropical diseases.

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1 SECTION 2. Not later than November 1, 2015, the executive 2 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall 3 adopt rules as required by Section 100.005, Health and Safety Code, 4 as added by this Act.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
