AN ACT

- 2 relating to immunity of a governmental entity for damage to certain
- 3 utility facilities.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 101.055, Civil Practice and Remedies
- 6 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 101.055. CERTAIN GOVERNMENTAL FUNCTIONS. (a) This
- 8 chapter does not apply to a claim arising:
- 9 (1) in connection with the assessment or collection of
- 10 taxes by a governmental unit;
- 11 (2) from the action of an employee while responding to
- 12 an emergency call or reacting to an emergency situation if the
- 13 action is in compliance with the laws and ordinances applicable to
- 14 emergency action, or in the absence of such a law or ordinance, if
- 15 the action is not taken with conscious indifference or reckless
- 16 disregard for the safety of others; [or]
- 17 (3) from the failure to provide or the method of
- 18 providing police or fire protection; or
- 19 (4) from the action of an employee causing damage to an
- 20 underground facility in the course of routine maintenance on a
- 21 public road right-of-way.
- 22 (b) In this section:
- 23 (1) "Routine maintenance" has the meaning assigned by
- 24 Section 251.156, Utilities Code.

- 1 (2) "Underground facility" has the meaning assigned by
- 2 <u>Section 251.002, Utilities Code.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to a claim arising on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 5 claim that arises before the effective date of this Act is governed
- 6 by the law applicable to the claim immediately before the effective
- 7 date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 8 purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
