2	relating to developing a pilot program to provide telemedicine

4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 32, Human Resources Code,
6	is amended by adding Section 32.076 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 32.076. PILOT PROGRAM FOR TELEMEDICINE MEDICAL
8	SERVICES FOR CHILDREN WITH CHRONIC OR COMPLEX MEDICAL NEEDS. (a)
9	In this section, "telemedicine medical service" means a health care
10	service that is provided by a physician for purposes of patient
11	assessment, diagnosis, consultation, or treatment, or for the
12	transfer of medical data, and that requires the use of advanced
13	telecommunications technology, other than telephone or facsimile
14	technology, including:
15	(1) compressed digital interactive video, audio, or
16	data transmission;
17	(2) clinical data transmission using computer imaging
18	by way of still-image capture and store and forward; and
19	(3) other technology that facilitates access to health
20	care services or medical specialty expertise.

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Subsection (c) to receive medical assistance benefits for health

(b) The department shall develop and implement a pilot

(1) enable an eligible child described under

1	care services provided in the child's residence through
2	telemedicine medical services; and
3	(2) provide reimbursement to a pediatric
4	subspecialist who provides telemedicine medical services under
5	Subdivision (1).
6	(c) A child is eligible for inclusion in the pilot program
7	under this section if the child:
8	(1) is a recipient of medical assistance; and
9	(2) has been diagnosed with:
10	(A) an end-stage solid organ disease; or
11	(B) a condition that, as determined by department
12	rule, requires:
13	(i) mechanical ventilation;
14	(ii) the child to be technology-dependent;
15	<u>or</u>
16	(iii) the child to be treated by three or
17	more specialists.
18	(d) The pilot program must require that the health care
19	services provided through telemedicine medical services:
20	(1) are provided by a pediatric subspecialist who:
21	(A) has clinical privileges at a tertiary
22	pediatric health care system that is associated with an academic
23	medical center; and
24	(B) has previously treated the child in person;
25	<u>and</u>
26	(2) do not replace the health care services the child
27	is otherwise receiving.

- 1 (e) The department shall conduct the pilot program in:
- 2 (1) Dallas, Tarrant, and Travis Counties; and
- 3 (2) the Northeast Texas and Central Texas Medicaid
- 4 Rural Service Area Regions.
- 5 (f) Not later than January 1, 2019, the department shall
- 6 report to the legislature on the results of the pilot program. The
- 7 <u>report must include:</u>
- 8 <u>(1) an evaluation of the clinical outcomes of the</u>
- 9 pilot program, including the program's success in reducing expected
- 10 emergency department visits; and
- 11 (2) the program's impact on medical costs.
- 12 (g) The executive commissioner may adopt rules to implement
- 13 this section.
- 14 (h) This section expires January 1, 2019.
- 15 SECTION 2. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 16 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 17 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 18 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 19 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 20 waiver or authorization is granted.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
