5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Section 1956.001, Occupations Code, is amended
7	by amending Subdivisions (4), (9), and (10) and adding Subdivision
8	(6-a) to read as follows:
9	(4) "Copper or brass material" means:
10	(A) <u>a power inverter or</u> insulated or
11	noninsulated copper wire or cable that contains copper or an alloy
12	of copper or zinc and is of the type used by:
13	(i) a public utility or common carrier;
14	(ii) a telecommunications provider as
15	defined by Section 51.002, Utilities Code;
16	(iii) a cable service provider as defined
17	by Section 66.002, Utilities Code; or
18	(iv) a video service provider as defined by
19	Section 66.002, Utilities Code [that contains copper or an alloy of
20	<pre>copper or zinc];</pre>
21	(B) a copper or brass item of a type commonly used
22	in construction or by:
23	(i) a public utility;
24	(ii) a telecommunications provider as

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defined by Section 51.002, Utilities Code;
(iii) a cable service provider as defined
by Section 66.002, Utilities Code; or
(iv) a video service provider as defined by
Section 66.002, Utilities Code; or
(C) copper pipe or copper tubing.
(6-a) "Lead material" means:
(A) a commercial grade lead battery, lead-acid
battery, or spiral cell battery; or
(B) a material or an item readily identifiable as
being made of or containing lead.
(9) "Regulated material" means:
(A) aluminum material;
(B) bronze material;
(C) copper or brass material; [or]
(D) <u>lead material; or</u>
(E) regulated metal.
(10) "Regulated metal" means:
(A) manhole covers;
(B) guardrails;
(C) metal cylinders designed to contain
compressed air, oxygen, gases, or liquids;
(D) beer kegs made from metal other than
aluminum;
(E) historical markers or cemetery vases,
receptacles, or memorials made from metal other than aluminum;
(F) unused rebar;

1 (G) street signs; 2 (H) drain gates; 3 (I) safes; 4 (J) communication, transmission, and service 5 wire or cable; 6 (K) condensing or evaporator coils for central 7 heating or air conditioning units; 8 (L) utility structures, including the fixtures 9 and hardware; 10 (M) aluminum or stainless steel containers designed to hold propane for fueling forklifts; 11 12 (N) metal railroad equipment, including tie plates, signal houses, control boxes, signs, signals, traffic 13 14 devices, traffic control devices, traffic control signals, switch 15 plates, e-clips, and rail tie functions; 16 (O) catalytic converters not attached to 17 vehicle; (P) fire hydrants; 18 metal bleachers or other seating facilities 19 used in recreational areas or sporting arenas; 20 21 any metal item clearly and conspicuously marked with any form of the name, initials, or logo of a 22 23 governmental entity, utility, cemetery, or railroad; 24 (S) insulated utility, communications, 25 electrical wire that has been burned in whole or in part to remove 26 the insulation:

- 7 SECTION 2. Section 1956.002, Occupations Code, is amended
- 8 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 1956.002. EXCEPTION. This chapter does not apply to:
- 10 (1) a purchase of regulated material from a public
- 11 utility, a telecommunications provider as defined by Section
- 12 <u>51.002</u>, Utilities Code, a cable service provider as defined by
- 13 <u>Section 66.002</u>, <u>Utilities Code</u>, <u>a video service provider as defined</u>
- 14 by Section 66.002, Utilities Code, or a manufacturing, industrial,
- 15 commercial, retail, or other seller that sells regulated material
- 16 in the ordinary course of the seller's business;
- 17 (2) a purchase of regulated material by a manufacturer
- 18 whose primary business is the manufacture of iron and steel
- 19 products made from melting scrap iron and scrap steel; or
- 20 (3) the transport or hauling of recyclable materials
- 21 to or from the metal recycling entity.
- SECTION 3. Section 1956.017(b), Occupations Code, is

- 10 transaction card issued by the entity or by another metal recycling

- 9 transaction card to the address provided on the application for the
- 10 <u>card.</u>
- 11 (f) A cash transaction card issued under this section is not
- 12 transferable.
- 13 (g) A metal recycling entity shall preserve:
- 14 (1) each application for a cash transaction card the
- 15 entity receives until the second anniversary of the date the
- 16 application was received; and
- 17 (2) a copy of each cash transaction card the entity
- 18 issues or renews until the second anniversary of the date the card
- 19 was issued or renewed.
- Sec. 1956.041. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. (a) The
- 21 commission, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing, may
- 22 impose an administrative penalty on a person who violates Section
- 23 <u>1956.036.</u>
- 24 (b) The amount of the administrative penalty may not exceed
- 25 \$1,000. Each day a violation occurs or continues to occur is a
- 26 separate violation for the purpose of imposing a penalty. In
- 27 determining the amount of the administrative penalty, the

- 1 commission shall consider:
- 2 (1) the seriousness of the violation, including the
- 3 nature, circumstances, extent, and gravity of the violation;
- 4 (2) the economic harm caused by the violation;
- 5 (3) the history of previous violations;
- 6 (4) the amount necessary to deter a future violation;
- 7 (5) efforts to correct the violation; and
- 8 (6) any other matter that justice may require.
- 9 (c) The enforcement of the administrative penalty may be
- 10 stayed during the time the order is under judicial review if the
- 11 person pays the penalty to the clerk of the court or files a
- 12 supersedeas bond with the court in the amount of the penalty. A
- 13 person who cannot afford to pay the penalty or file the bond may
- 14 stay the enforcement by filing an affidavit in the manner required
- 15 by the Texas Rules of Civil Procedure for a party who cannot afford
- 16 to file security for costs, subject to the right of the commission
- 17 to contest the affidavit as provided by those rules.
- 18 (d) The attorney general may sue to collect the
- 19 administrative penalty.
- 20 (e) A proceeding to impose an administrative penalty is
- 21 considered to be a contested case under Chapter 2001, Government
- 22 Code.
- SECTION 8. Section 1956.041, Occupations Code, as added by
- 24 this Act, applies only to a violation of Section 1956.036,
- 25 Occupations Code, committed on or after the effective date of this
- 26 Act. A violation committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 27 governed by the law in effect on the date the violation was

- 1 committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 2 purpose.
- 3 SECTION 9. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 4 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 5 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 6 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 7 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 8 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 9 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 10 before that date.
- 11 SECTION 10. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 12 of this Act, the public safety director of the Department of Public
- 13 Safety of the State of Texas shall appoint the three additional
- 14 members to the advisory committee as required by Section 1956.017,
- 15 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 11. During the calendar year ending December 31,
- 17 2023, the advisory committee established under Section 1956.017,
- 18 Occupations Code, as amended by this Act, shall study the effects of
- 19 the cash transaction card provisions of Section 1956.0382,
- 20 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, and report the committee's
- 21 findings and recommendations to the legislature before December 1,
- 22 2024.
- 23 SECTION 12. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
