11	engage in a particular business.
12	(2) "State agency" means a department, board, bureau,
13	commission, committee, division, office, council, or agency of this
14	state.
15	Sec. 60.002. FINGERPRINTING OF CERTAIN LICENSE APPLICANTS
16	PROHIBITED. (a) Notwithstanding any other law and except as
17	provided by this section, a state agency that issues a license may
18	not require an applicant for the license to submit fingerprints to
19	the agency, the Department of Public Safety, or any other person as
20	a requirement for the issuance or renewal of the license.
21	(b) This section does not apply to an applicant for a
22	license issued under Chapter 1701 or 1702.
23	SECTION 2. Chapter 60, Occupations Code, as added by this
24	Act, applies only to an application for the issuance or renewal of

1 an occupational license filed on or after the effective date of this
2 Act. An application filed before that date is governed by the law
3 in effect on the date the application was filed, and the former law
4 is continued in effect for that purpose.

5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
