1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the transfer of the oversight of the Texas State
- 3 Cemetery to the State Preservation Board and to the creation of the
- 4 State Cemetery preservation trust fund.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2165.007(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission shall
- 9 provide facilities management services in relation to all state
- 10 agency facilities in Travis County or a county adjacent to Travis
- 11 County. The commission's duty does not apply to:
- 12 (1) a facility owned or operated by an institution of
- 13 higher education;
- 14 (2) military facilities;
- 15 (3) facilities owned or operated by the Texas
- 16 Department of Criminal Justice;
- 17 (4) facilities owned or operated by the Texas Juvenile
- 18 Justice Department;
- 19 (5) facilities owned or operated by the Texas
- 20 Department of Transportation;
- 21 (6) the Capitol, including the Capitol Extension, the
- 22 General Land Office building, the Bob Bullock Texas State History
- 23 Museum, any museum located on the Capitol grounds, the Governor's
- 24 Mansion, and any property maintained by the Texas Historical

- 1 Commission under Sections 442.0072 and 442.0073;
- 2 (7) a facility determined by the commission to be
- 3 completely residential;
- 4 (8) a regional or field office of a state agency;
- 5 (9) a facility located within or on state park
- 6 property;
- 7 (10) the property known as the Finance Commission
- 8 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 5080, Page 1099, of
- 9 the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas;
- 10 (11) the property known as the Credit Union Department
- 11 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 6126, Page 27, of the
- 12 Deed Records of Travis County, Texas;
- 13 (12) facilities owned or operated by the Texas School
- 14 for the Blind and Visually Impaired; [or]
- 15 (13) facilities owned or operated by the Texas School
- 16 for the Deaf; or
- 17 (14) the property known as the Texas State Cemetery
- 18 described as 17.376 acres located at 801 Comal, Lot 5, Division B,
- 19 City of Austin, Travis County, Texas.
- 20 SECTION 2. Section 2165.256, Government Code, is amended by
- 21 amending Subsections (a), (e), (i), and (m) and adding Subsection
- 22 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 23 (a) <u>In this section:</u>
- 24 (1) "Board" means the State Preservation Board.
- 25 "Committee" means the State Cemetery Committee.
- 26 <u>(a-1)</u> The <u>board</u>, in cooperation with the committee, shall
- 27 govern and provide oversight, adopt rules and policies, and provide

- 1 for the operation of the State Cemetery [State Cemetery Committee
- 2 shall oversee all operations of the State Cemetery. The committee
- 3 shall develop a budget for the operations of the commission
- 4 relating to the State Cemetery and determine the salary of
- 5 employees of the commission whose duties primarily relate to the
- 6 operation of the State Cemetery].

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- 7 (e) The committee shall review the names of state officials 8 presented to the committee for consideration under Subsection (d)(3), in proclamations under Subsection (d)(4), <u>in</u> 9 10 resolutions under Subsection (d)(5). A person whose name is presented to the committee or who is specified in a proclamation or 11 resolution is eligible for burial in the State Cemetery only if the 12 committee, following its review, finds that the person specified 13 14 made a significant contribution to Texas history and only if, based 15 on that finding, the committee approves the person's burial in the cemetery. The committee may by order authorize a burial under 16 17 Subsection (d)(6) only if the committee finds that the person made a significant contribution to Texas history, which may include a 18 person who served this state through public administration or 19 governmental service. 20
 - (i) The <u>board</u>, in <u>collaboration</u> with the committee, shall adopt rules regulating the monuments erected in the State Cemetery.
- (m) The committee shall consider for burial in the State
 Cemetery persons who have made significant contributions to Texas
 history and culture in the following fields: air and space,
 agriculture, art and design, business and labor, city building,
 education, governmental service, industry, justice, military

- 1 affairs, law enforcement, oil and gas, performing arts,
- 2 philanthropy, <u>public administration</u>, ranching, religion, science
- 3 and medicine, sports, and writing.
- 4 SECTION 3. Section 2165.2561, Government Code, is amended
- 5 by amending Subsections (a), (c), (g), (m), (p), (q), and (r) and
- 6 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 7 (a) <u>In this section:</u>
- 8 (1) "Board" means the State Preservation Board.
- 9 (2) "Committee" means the State Cemetery Committee.
- 10 $\underline{\text{(a-1)}}$ The $\underline{\text{committee}}$ [State Cemetery Committee] is composed
- 11 of:
- 12 (1) three voting members appointed as follows:
- (A) one member of the general public appointed by
- 14 the governor;
- 15 (B) one member of the general public appointed by
- 16 the governor from a list submitted by the lieutenant governor; and
- 17 (C) one member of the general public appointed by
- 18 the governor from a list submitted by the speaker of the house of
- 19 representatives; and
- 20 (2) three nonvoting advisory members appointed as
- 21 follows:
- (A) one employee of the Texas Historical
- 23 Commission appointed by the executive director of the Texas
- 24 Historical Commission;
- 25 (B) one employee of the board [Texas Building and
- 26 Procurement Commission appointed by the executive director of the
- 27 board [Texas Building and Procurement Commission]; and

- 1 (C) one employee of the Parks and Wildlife
- 2 Department appointed by the executive director of the Parks and
- 3 Wildlife Department.
- 4 (c) The voting members of the committee [appointed by the
- 5 governor] are appointed for staggered terms of six years with one
- 6 member's term expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year. The
- 7 advisory members of the committee serve at the will of the
- 8 appointing authority.
- 9 (g) A person is not eligible for appointment to the
- 10 committee <u>under Subsection (a-1)(1)</u> [by the governor] if the person
- 11 or the person's spouse:
- 12 (1) is employed by or participates in the management
- 13 of a business entity or other organization receiving funds from the
- 14 committee;
- 15 (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
- 16 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 17 organization receiving funds from the committee; or
- 18 (3) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 19 goods, services, or funds from the committee, other than
- 20 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for committee
- 21 membership, attendance, or expenses.
- 22 (m) The <u>board</u>, in <u>collaboration</u> with the committee, may
- 23 adopt rules as necessary for the administration of the State
- 24 Cemetery.
- 25 (p) If the executive director of the board [commission] has
- 26 knowledge that a potential ground for removal from the committee
- 27 exists, the executive director shall notify the presiding officer

- 1 of the committee of the potential ground. The presiding officer
- 2 shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a
- 3 potential ground for removal exists. If the potential ground for
- 4 removal involves the presiding officer, the executive director
- 5 shall notify the next highest ranking officer of the committee, who
- 6 shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a
- 7 potential ground for removal exists.
- 8 (q) The executive director of the board [commission] or the
- 9 executive director's designee shall provide to members of the
- 10 committee, as often as necessary, information regarding the
- 11 requirements for office under this chapter, including information
- 12 regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable laws
- 13 relating to standards of conduct for state officers.
- 14 (r) A person who is appointed to and qualifies for office as
- 15 a member of the committee may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as
- 16 a member in attendance at a meeting of the committee until the
- 17 person completes a training program that complies with this
- 18 subsection. The training program must provide the person with
- 19 information regarding:
- 20 (1) the legislation that created the State Cemetery
- 21 and the committee [State Cemetery Committee];
- 22 (2) the programs operated by the committee;
- 23 (3) the role and functions of the committee;
- 24 (4) the rules of the committee, with an emphasis on any
- 25 rules that relate to disciplinary and investigatory authority;
- 26 (5) [the current budget for the committee;
- [(6)] the results of the most recent formal audit of

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          SECTION 4. Subchapter F, Chapter 2165, Government Code, is
    amended by adding Section 2165.2565 to read as follows:
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          Sec. 2165.2565. STATE CEMETERY PRESERVATION TRUST FUND.
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   (a) The State Cemetery preservation trust fund is created as a
   trust fund outside the state treasury to be held with the
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   comptroller in trust. The State Preservation Board, in
   consultation with the State Cemetery Committee, shall administer
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   the fund as trustee on behalf of the people of this state. The fund
   consists of money:
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               (1) transferred or appropriated to the fund; and
               (2) received by the State Cemetery Committee under
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   Section 2165.256(s) and deposited to the fund by the State

   Preservation Board for the committee.
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          (b) The interest received from investment of money in the
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   fund shall be credited to the fund.
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(c) Money in the fund may be used only to:

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- 1 (1) maintain, renovate, make major repairs or capital
- 2 improvements to, or preserve the State Cemetery, as determined by
- 3 the State Preservation Board; or
- 4 (2) acquire land in close proximity to the State
- 5 Cemetery for expansion of the cemetery.
- 6 SECTION 5. The following provisions of the Government Code
- 7 are repealed:
- 8 (1) Sections 2165.256(b), (b-1), and (r); and
- 9 (2) Sections 2165.2561(k), (1), and (t).
- 10 SECTION 6. (a) On the effective date of this Act:
- 11 (1) an employee of the Texas Facilities Commission who
- 12 was performing duties exclusively related to the Texas State
- 13 Cemetery becomes an employee of the State Preservation Board;
- 14 (2) all money, contracts, leases, rights, and
- 15 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas
- 16 State Cemetery are transferred to the State Preservation Board;
- 17 (3) all property, including records, in the custody of
- 18 the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery
- 19 becomes the property of the State Preservation Board; and
- 20 (4) all funds appropriated by the legislature to the
- 21 Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery are
- 22 transferred to the State Preservation Board and may be disbursed to
- 23 the State Cemetery Committee as provided by this Act.
- 24 (b) A rule adopted by the State Cemetery Committee or the
- 25 Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery
- 26 before the effective date of this Act is continued in effect as a
- 27 rule of the State Preservation Board until amended or repealed by

- 1 the board.
- 2 (c) A function or activity performed by the Texas Facilities
- 3 Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery is transferred to
- 4 the State Preservation Board as provided by this Act.
- 5 (d) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 6 Act, the State Preservation Board shall appoint a nonvoting
- 7 advisory member to the State Cemetery Committee as required by
- 8 Section 2165.2561(a-1)(2), Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 7. Notwithstanding Section 222.002, Transportation
- 10 Code, or any other law, as soon as practicable after the sale of
- 11 property that is the subject of Section 2165.256(b-1), Government
- 12 Code, as that section existed immediately before the effective date
- 13 of this Act, the comptroller of public accounts shall transfer from
- 14 the state highway fund to the State Cemetery preservation trust
- 15 fund, as created by this Act, an amount of money equal to the
- 16 portion of the proceeds attributable to the sale of that property
- 17 that is required to be deposited by the Texas Department of
- 18 Transportation in a subaccount in the state highway fund for use by
- 19 the State Preservation Board for the State Cemetery Committee under
- 20 the terms of a memorandum of understanding entered into between the
- 21 department and the State Cemetery Committee.
- 22 SECTION 8. To the extent of any conflict, this Act controls
- 23 over another Act of the 84th Legislature, Regular Session, 2015,
- 24 that is enacted and becomes law, relating to the creation of the
- 25 State Cemetery preservation trust fund.
- SECTION 9. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
