A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT relating to transfer of the oversight of the Texas State Cemetery to the State Preservation Board. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 2165.007(b), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: Notwithstanding any other law, the commission shall (b) provide facilities management services in relation to all state agency facilities in Travis County or a county adjacent to Travis County. The commission's duty does not apply to: (1) a facility owned or operated by an institution of higher education; (2) military facilities; (3) facilities owned or operated by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice; (4) facilities owned or operated by the Texas Juvenile Justice Department; (5) facilities owned or operated by the Texas Department of Transportation; (6) the Capitol, including the Capitol Extension, the General Land Office building, the Bob Bullock Texas State History Museum, any museum located on the Capitol grounds, the Governor's Mansion, and any property maintained by the Texas Historical

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Commission under Sections 442.0072 and 442.0073;

No. 2206 1 (7) a facility determined by the commission to be completely residential; 2 a regional or field office of a state agency; 3 (8) 4 (9) a facility located within or on state park 5 property; the property known as the Finance Commission 6 (10) 7 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 5080, Page 1099, of 8 the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas; (11)9 the property known as the Credit Union Department 10 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 6126, Page 27, of the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas; 11 facilities owned or operated by the Texas School 12 (12) for the Blind and Visually Impaired; [or] 13 14 (13)facilities owned or operated by the Texas School 15 for the Deaf; or 16 (14) the property known as the Texas State Cemetery 17 described as 17.376 acres located at 801 Comal, Lot 5, Division B, City of Austin, Travis County, Texas. 18 SECTION 2. Section 2165.256, Government Code, is amended by 19 amending Subsections (a), (e), (i), and (m) and adding Subsection 20 (a-1) to read as follows: 21 (a) In this section: 22 23 (1) "Board" means the State Preservation Board. 24 (2) "Committee" means the State Cemetery Committee. 25 (a-1) The board, in cooperation with the committee, shall 26 govern and provide oversight, adopt rules and policies, and provide for the operation of the State Cemetery [State Cemetery Committee 27

1 shall oversee all operations of the State Cemetery. The committee
2 shall develop a budget for the operations of the commission
3 relating to the State Cemetery and determine the salary of

The committee may by order authorize a burial under Subsection (d)(6) only if the committee finds that the person made a 16 17 significant contribution to Texas history, which may include a person who served this state through public administration or 18 19 governmental service.

(i) The <u>board, in collaboration with the</u> committee, shall
adopt rules regulating the monuments erected in the State Cemetery.

(m) The committee shall consider for burial in the State Cemetery persons who have made significant contributions to Texas history and culture in the following fields: air and space, agriculture, art and design, business and labor, city building, education, <u>governmental service</u>, industry, justice, military affairs, law enforcement, oil and gas, performing arts,

Section 2165.2561, Government Code, is amended 3 by amending Subsections (a), (c), (g), (m), (p), (q), and (r) and 4 5 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows: (a) In this section: 6 (1) "Board" means the State Preservation Board. 7 8 (2) "Committee" means the State Cemetery Committee. (a-1) The committee [State Cemetery Committee] is composed 9 10 of: three voting members appointed as follows: 11 (1) 12 (A) one member of the general public appointed by 13 the governor; 14 (B) one member of the general public appointed by 15 the governor from a list submitted by the lieutenant governor; and 16 (C) one member of the general public appointed by 17 the governor from a list submitted by the speaker of the house of representatives; and 18 (2) three nonvoting advisory members appointed as 19 follows: 20 21 (A) one employee of the Texas Historical Commission appointed by the executive director of the Texas 22 Historical Commission; 23 24 (B) one employee of the board [Texas Building and 25 Procurement Commission] appointed by the executive director of the 26 board [Texas Building and Procurement Commission]; and 27 (C) one employee of the Parks and Wildlife

Department appointed by the executive director of the Parks and

3 (c) The <u>voting</u> members of the committee [appointed by the 4 governor] are appointed for staggered terms of six years with one 5 member's term expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year. The 6 advisory members of the committee serve at the will of the 7 appointing authority.

8 (g) A person is not eligible for appointment to the 9 committee <u>under Subsection (a-1)(1)</u> [by the governor] if the person 10 or the person's spouse:

(1) is employed by or participates in the management of a business entity or other organization receiving funds from the committee;

14 (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more 15 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other 16 organization receiving funds from the committee; or

17 (3) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible 18 goods, services, or funds from the committee, other than 19 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for committee 20 membership, attendance, or expenses.

(m) The <u>board, in collaboration with the</u> committee, may adopt rules as necessary for the administration of the State Cemetery.

(p) If the executive director of the <u>board</u> [commission] has
knowledge that a potential ground for removal <u>from the committee</u>
exists, the executive director shall notify the presiding officer
of the committee of the potential ground. The presiding officer

1 shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a 2 potential ground for removal exists. If the potential ground for 3 removal involves the presiding officer, the executive director 4 shall notify the next highest ranking officer of the committee, who 5 shall then notify the governor and the attorney general that a 6 potential ground for removal exists.

7 (q) The executive director of the <u>board</u> [commission] or the 8 executive director's designee shall provide to members of the 9 committee, as often as necessary, information regarding the 10 requirements for office under this chapter, including information 11 regarding a person's responsibilities under applicable laws 12 relating to standards of conduct for state officers.

(r) A person who is appointed to and qualifies for office as a member of the committee may not vote, deliberate, or be counted as a member in attendance at a meeting of the committee until the person completes a training program that complies with this subsection. The training program must provide the person with information regarding:

SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Government Code 11 12 are repealed: Sections 2165.256(b), (b-1), and (r); and 13 (1)14 (2) Sections 2165.2561(k), (1), and (t). 15 SECTION 5. (a) On the effective date of this Act: 16 an employee of the Texas Facilities Commission who (1)17 was performing duties exclusively related to the Texas State Cemetery becomes an employee of the State Preservation Board; 18 19 (2) all money, contracts, leases, rights, and obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas 20 State Cemetery are transferred to the State Preservation Board; 21 22 (3) all property, including records, in the custody of 23 the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery 24 becomes the property of the State Preservation Board; and 25 all funds appropriated by the legislature to the (4) 26 Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery are transferred to the State Preservation Board and may be disbursed to 27

1 the State Cemetery Committee as provided by this Act.

2 (b) A rule adopted by the State Cemetery Committee or the 3 Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery 4 before the effective date of this Act is continued in effect as a 5 rule of the State Preservation Board until amended or repealed by 6 the board.

7 (c) A function or activity performed by the Texas Facilities
8 Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery is transferred to
9 the State Preservation Board as provided by this Act.

10 (d) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this 11 Act, the State Preservation Board shall appoint a nonvoting 12 advisory member to the State Cemetery Committee as required by 13 Section 2165.2561(a-1)(2), Government Code, as amended by this Act. 14 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
