A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to transfer of the oversight of the Texas State Cemetery to
- 3 the State Cemetery Committee and to transfer of cemetery funding to
- 4 the State Preservation Board.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2165.007(b), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (b) Notwithstanding any other law, the commission shall
- 9 provide facilities management services in relation to all state
- 10 agency facilities in Travis County or a county adjacent to Travis
- 11 County. The commission's duty does not apply to:
- 12 (1) a facility owned or operated by an institution of
- 13 higher education;
- 14 (2) military facilities;
- 15 (3) facilities owned or operated by the Texas
- 16 Department of Criminal Justice;
- 17 (4) facilities owned or operated by the Texas Juvenile
- 18 Justice Department;
- 19 (5) facilities owned or operated by the Texas
- 20 Department of Transportation;
- 21 (6) the Capitol, including the Capitol Extension, the
- 22 General Land Office building, the Bob Bullock Texas State History
- 23 Museum, any museum located on the Capitol grounds, the Governor's
- 24 Mansion, and any property maintained by the Texas Historical

- 1 Commission under Sections 442.0072 and 442.0073;
- 2 (7) a facility determined by the commission to be
- 3 completely residential;
- 4 (8) a regional or field office of a state agency;
- 5 (9) a facility located within or on state park
- 6 property;
- 7 (10) the property known as the Finance Commission
- 8 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 5080, Page 1099, of
- 9 the Deed Records of Travis County, Texas;
- 10 (11) the property known as the Credit Union Department
- 11 Building described by deed recorded in Volume 6126, Page 27, of the
- 12 Deed Records of Travis County, Texas;
- 13 (12) facilities owned or operated by the Texas School
- 14 for the Blind and Visually Impaired; [or]
- 15 (13) facilities owned or operated by the Texas School
- 16 for the Deaf; or
- 17 (14) the property known as the Texas State Cemetery
- 18 described as 17.376 acres located at 801 Comal, Lot 5, Division B,
- 19 City of Austin, Travis County, Texas.
- 20 SECTION 2. Sections 2165.256(a), (d), (e), and (m),
- 21 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 22 (a) The State Cemetery Committee shall oversee and exercise
- 23 <u>direct control of</u> all operations of the State Cemetery. The
- 24 committee shall develop a budget for the operations of [the
- 25 commission relating to] the State Cemetery and determine the salary
- 26 of State Cemetery employees, including a superintendent and other
- 27 staff. The committee may delegate authority granted under this

- 1 subsection and the management, maintenance, and operation of the
- 2 State Cemetery to the superintendent [of the commission whose
- 3 duties primarily relate to the operation of the State Cemetery].
- 4 (d) Persons eligible for burial in the State Cemetery are:
- 5 (1) a former member of the legislature or a member who
- 6 dies in office;
- 7 (2) a former elective state official or an elective
- 8 state official who dies in office;
- 9 (3) a former state official or a state official who
- 10 dies in office who has been appointed by the governor and confirmed
- 11 by the senate and who served at least \underline{six} [10] years in the office to
- 12 which appointed, subject to review and approval by the committee
- 13 <u>under Subsection (e)</u>;
- 14 (4) a person specified by a governor's proclamation,
- 15 subject to review and approval by the committee under Subsection
- 16 (e);
- 17 (5) a person specified by a concurrent resolution
- 18 adopted by the legislature, subject to review and approval by the
- 19 committee under Subsection (e); and
- 20 (6) a person specified by order of the committee under
- 21 Subsection (e).
- (e) The committee shall review the names of state officials
- 23 presented to the committee for consideration under Subsection
- 24 $\underline{(d)(3)}$, \underline{in} proclamations under Subsection $\underline{(d)(4)}$, and \underline{in}
- 25 resolutions under Subsection (d)(5). A person whose name is
- 26 presented to the committee or who is specified in a proclamation or
- 27 resolution is eligible for burial in the State Cemetery only if the

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- 1 committee, following its review, finds that the person specified
- 2 made a significant contribution to Texas history and only if, based
- 3 on that finding, the committee approves the person's burial in the
- 4 cemetery. The committee may by order authorize a burial under
- 5 Subsection (d)(6) only if the committee finds that the person made a
- 6 significant contribution to Texas history, which may include a
- 7 person who served this state through public administration or
- 8 governmental service.
- 9 (m) The committee shall consider for burial in the State
- 10 Cemetery persons who have made significant contributions to Texas
- 11 history and culture in the following fields: air and space,
- 12 agriculture, art and design, business and labor, city building,
- 13 education, governmental service, industry, justice, military
- 14 affairs, law enforcement, oil and gas, performing arts,
- 15 philanthropy, <u>public administration</u>, ranching, religion, science
- 16 and medicine, sports, and writing.
- 17 SECTION 3. Sections 2165.2561(a), (b), (c), (g), (k), (l),
- 18 (m), (p), (q), and (t), Government Code, are amended to read as
- 19 follows:
- 20 (a) The State Cemetery Committee is composed of:
- 21 (1) three voting members appointed as follows:
- (A) one member of the general public appointed by
- 23 the governor;
- (B) one member of the general public appointed by
- 25 the governor from a list submitted by the lieutenant governor; and
- (C) one member of the general public appointed by
- 27 the governor from a list submitted by the speaker of the house of

- 1 representatives; and
- 2 (2) one [three] nonvoting advisory member who is an
- 3 [members appointed as follows:
- 4 [(A) one] employee of the <u>State Preservation</u>
- 5 Board [Texas Historical Commission] appointed by the executive
- 6 director of the board [Texas Historical Commission;
- 7 [(B) one employee of the Texas Building and
- 8 Procurement Commission appointed by the executive director of the
- 9 Texas Building and Procurement Commission; and
- 10 [(C) one employee of the Parks and Wildlife
- 11 Department appointed by the executive director of the Parks and
- 12 Wildlife Department].
- 13 (b) The voting member serving the last two years of the
- 14 member's term is [governor shall designate] the presiding officer
- 15 of the committee [from among its members, and the presiding officer
- 16 shall serve in that capacity for two years].
- 17 (c) The voting members of the committee [appointed by the
- 18 governor] are appointed for staggered terms of six years with one
- 19 member's term expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered year. The
- 20 advisory member [members] of the committee serves [serve] at the
- 21 will of the <u>State Preservation Board</u> [appointing authority].
- 22 (g) A person is not eligible for appointment to the
- 23 committee <u>under Subsection (a)(1)</u> [by the governor] if the person
- 24 or the person's spouse:
- 25 (1) is employed by or participates in the management
- 26 of a business entity or other organization receiving funds from the
- 27 committee;

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- 1 (2) owns or controls, directly or indirectly, more
- 2 than a 10 percent interest in a business entity or other
- 3 organization receiving funds from the committee; or
- 4 (3) uses or receives a substantial amount of tangible
- 5 goods, services, or funds from the committee, other than
- 6 compensation or reimbursement authorized by law for committee
- 7 membership, attendance, or expenses.
- 8 (k) The legislature shall separately appropriate money to
- 9 the committee within the appropriations to the State Preservation
- 10 <u>Board</u> [Texas Building and Procurement Commission] for all matters
- 11 relating to the operation of the State Cemetery. [Activities
- 12 relating to maintenance of the State Cemetery grounds and monuments
- 13 shall conform to quidelines for historic preservation submitted to
- 14 the committee by the Texas Historical Commission.
- 15 (1) Funds appropriated to the <u>State Preservation Board</u>
- 16 <u>shall</u> [Texas Building and Procurement Commission may] be
- 17 transferred by interagency contract for the performance of, at the
- 18 direction of the committee, an act related to the State Cemetery,
- 19 including funds for cemetery operation and maintenance, salaries
- 20 for the superintendent and staff, clothing and allowances for
- 21 <u>cemetery employees</u>, and food and drinks for inmates or other
- 22 persons who are providing maintenance services. The State
- 23 Preservation Board shall provide the administrative and accounting
- 24 support required by the committee.
- 25 (m) The committee may adopt rules and policies as necessary
- 26 for the administration of the State Cemetery, including policies on
- 27 personnel, grounds operation, security, and other matters related

- 1 to cemetery operations.
- 2 (p) If the <u>superintendent</u> [executive director] of the <u>State</u>
- 3 <u>Cemetery</u> [commission] has knowledge that a potential ground for
- 4 removal from the committee exists, the superintendent [executive
- 5 director | shall notify the presiding officer of the committee of
- 6 the potential ground. The presiding officer shall then notify the
- 7 governor and the attorney general that a potential ground for
- 8 removal exists. If the potential ground for removal involves the
- 9 presiding officer, the superintendent [executive director] shall
- 10 notify the next highest ranking officer of the committee, who shall
- 11 then notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential
- 12 ground for removal exists.
- 13 (q) The superintendent [executive director] of the State
- 14 Cemetery [commission] or the superintendent's [executive
- 15 director's designee shall provide to members of the committee, as
- 16 often as necessary, information regarding the requirements for
- 17 office under this chapter, including information regarding a
- 18 person's responsibilities under applicable laws relating to
- 19 standards of conduct for state officers.
- 20 (t) The committee shall develop and implement policies that
- 21 clearly separate the policymaking responsibilities of the
- 22 committee and the management responsibilities of the
- 23 superintendent [executive director of the commission] and staff of
- 24 the cemetery.
- 25 SECTION 4. The following provisions of the Government Code
- 26 are repealed:
- 27 (1) Sections 2165.256(b), (b-1), and (r); and

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1 (2) Sections 2165.2561(f) and (j).
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- 2 SECTION 5. (a) On the effective date of this Act:
- 3 (1) an employee of the Texas Facilities Commission who
- 4 was performing duties exclusively related to the Texas State
- 5 Cemetery becomes an employee of the State Cemetery Committee;
- 6 (2) all money, contracts, leases, rights, and
- 7 obligations of the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas
- 8 State Cemetery are transferred to the State Cemetery Committee;
- 9 (3) all property, including records, in the custody of
- 10 the Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery
- 11 becomes the property of the State Cemetery Committee; and
- 12 (4) all funds appropriated by the legislature to the
- 13 Texas Facilities Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery are
- 14 transferred to the State Preservation Board to be transferred to
- 15 the State Cemetery Committee as required under this Act.
- 16 (b) A function or activity performed by the Texas Facilities
- 17 Commission related to the Texas State Cemetery is transferred to
- 18 the State Cemetery Committee or the State Preservation Board, as
- 19 applicable, as provided by this Act. The board shall provide the
- 20 administrative and accounting support required by the committee.
- 21 (c) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 22 Act, the State Preservation Board shall appoint a nonvoting
- 23 advisory member to the State Cemetery Committee as required by
- 24 Section 2165.2561(a)(2), Government Code, as amended by this Act.
- 25 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
