H.B. No. 2255

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the regulation of plumbing. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 3 SECTION 1. Sections 1301.002(2), (3), and (4), Occupations 4 5 Code, are amended to read as follows: "Drain cleaner" means a person who: 6 (2) 7 (A) has completed at least 4,000 hours working under the supervision of a responsible master plumber as a drain 8 9 cleaner-restricted registrant; (B) has fulfilled the requirements of and is 10 11 registered with the board; and 12 (C) installs cleanouts and removes and resets p-traps to eliminate obstructions in building drains and sewers 13 under the supervision of a responsible master plumber. 14 (3) "Drain cleaner-restricted registrant" means 15 a 16 person who: has worked as a plumber's apprentice under 17 (A) the supervision of a responsible master plumber; 18 (B) has fulfilled the requirements of and is 19 20 registered with the board; and 21 (C) clears obstructions in sewer and drain lines 22 through any code-approved existing opening under the supervision of 23 a responsible master plumber. 24 (4) "Journeyman plumber" means a person licensed under

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1 this chapter who: 2 has met the qualifications for registration (A) 3 as a plumber's apprentice or for licensing as a tradesman plumber-limited license holder; 4 5 (B) has completed at least 8,000 hours working under the supervision of a responsible master plumber; 6 7 installs, changes, repairs, services, (C) or 8 renovates plumbing or supervises any of those activities under the supervision of a responsible master plumber; 9 10 (D) has passed the required examination; and has fulfilled the other requirements of the 11 (E) 12 board. SECTION 2. Section 1301.354(c), Occupations 13 Code, is 14 amended to read as follows: 15 (c) At the applicant's request, the board may credit an applicant under Subsection (b) with up to 1,000 [500] hours of the 16 17 work experience required before taking an examination if the applicant has completed the classroom portion of a training 18 19 program: 20 approved by the United States Department of Labor, (1)Office of Apprenticeship; or 21 provided by a person approved by the board and 22 (2) 23 based on course materials approved by the board. 24 SECTION 3. (a) The changes in law made by this Act apply only to an application for a certificate of registration as a drain 25 cleaner or drain cleaner-restricted registrant submitted on or 26 after the effective date of this Act. An application for a 27

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1 certificate of registration submitted before the effective date of 2 this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 3 application was submitted, and the former law is continued in 4 effect for that purpose.

5 (b) A person who holds a certificate of registration as a 6 drain cleaner or drain cleaner-restricted registrant issued before 7 the effective date of this Act may continue to renew that 8 certificate of registration without complying with the changes in 9 law made by this Act relating to the work requirement under the 10 supervision of a responsible master plumber.

11 (c) The change in law made by this Act applies only to an 12 application for a license as a journeyman plumber submitted on or 13 after the effective date of this Act. An application for a license 14 submitted before the effective date of this Act is governed by the 15 law in effect on the date the application was submitted, and the 16 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

(d) A person who holds a license as a journeyman plumber issued before the effective date of this Act may continue to renew that license without complying with the changes in law made by this Act relating to the work requirement under the supervision of a responsible master plumber.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
