5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subtitle C, Title 3, Occupations Code, is
7	amended by adding Chapter 207 to read as follows:
8	CHAPTER 207. ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 207.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Anesthesiologist" means a physician licensed by
12	the Texas Medical Board who specializes in anesthesiology.
13	(2) "Anesthesiologist assistant" means a person who
14	holds a license issued under this chapter.
15	(3) "Medical board" means the Texas Medical Board.
16	SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF MEDICAL BOARD
17	Sec. 207.051. POWERS AND DUTIES OF MEDICAL BOARD RELATING
18	TO ANESTHESIOLOGIST ASSISTANTS. (a) The medical board shall
19	administer and enforce this chapter.
20	(b) The medical board:
21	(1) may establish requirements to obtain an
22	anesthesiologist assistant license, including education and
23	training requirements, in addition to the requirements under
24	Section 207.103;

- 1 (2) may establish examination requirements for an
- 2 anesthesiologist assistant license in addition to the requirements
- 3 under Section 207.103;
- 4 (3) shall prescribe application requirements for a
- 5 license to practice as an anesthesiologist assistant; and
- 6 (4) shall develop an approved program of mandatory
- 7 continuing education and the manner by which attendance at all
- 8 approved courses, clinics, forums, lectures, programs, or seminars
- 9 is monitored and recorded.
- Sec. 207.052. RULES. (a) The medical board shall adopt
- 11 rules necessary to implement this chapter.
- 12 (b) The rules adopted by the medical board must include
- 13 requirements and limitations on the provision of anesthesia
- 14 services by an anesthesiologist assistant as determined by the
- 15 medical board to be in the best interests of patient health and
- 16 <u>safety</u>, including:
- 17 (1) a requirement that an anesthesiologist assistant
- 18 be supervised by an anesthesiologist who is actively engaged in
- 19 clinical practice and available on-site to provide assistance to
- 20 the anesthesiologist assistant;
- 21 (2) a limit on the number of anesthesiologist
- 22 <u>assistants</u> and <u>student</u> <u>anesthesiologist</u> <u>assistants</u> an
- 23 anesthesiologist may supervise, in accordance with any
- 24 requirements of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services; and
- 25 (3) a requirement that an anesthesiologist assistant
- 26 shall maintain compliance with all continuing education
- 27 requirements adopted by the medical board and with recertification

- 1 requirements of the National Commission for Certification of
- 2 Anesthesiologist Assistants or its successor organization.
- 3 Sec. 207.053. FEES. The medical board shall set and collect
- 4 fees in amounts that are reasonable and necessary to cover the costs
- 5 of administering and enforcing this chapter without the use of any
- 6 other funds generated by the medical board.
- 7 <u>Sec. 207.054. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Procedures under</u>
- 8 Subtitle B, Title 3, that govern license or registration renewal,
- 9 complaints, and disciplinary actions apply to an anesthesiologist
- 10 assistant in the same manner the provisions apply to a physician.
- SUBCHAPTER C. LICENSE REQUIREMENTS
- Sec. 207.101. LICENSE REQUIRED. A person may not practice
- 13 as an anesthesiologist assistant in this state unless the person
- 14 holds an anesthesiologist assistant license issued under this
- 15 <u>chapter.</u>
- Sec. 207.102. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE. The medical board shall
- 17 issue a license to an applicant who:
- (1) meets the eligibility requirements of Section
- 19 207.103;
- 20 (2) submits an application on a form prescribed by the
- 21 medical board; and
- 22 (3) pays the required application and licensing fees.
- Sec. 207.103. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS. To be eligible for
- 24 a license under this chapter, an applicant must:
- 25 (1) submit proof of completion of a graduate level
- 26 training program accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of
- 27 Allied Health Education Programs or its successor organization;

- 1 (2) pass a certifying examination administered by the
- 2 National Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist
- 3 Assistants or its successor organization not later than 12 months
- 4 from the date of completion of the training program required under
- 5 Subdivision (1);
- 6 (3) submit proof of current certification from the
- 7 National Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist
- 8 Assistants or its successor organization;
- 9 (4) be of good moral character; and
- 10 (5) meet any additional qualifications adopted by the
- 11 medical board by rule.
- 12 SUBCHAPTER D. PRACTICE BY LICENSE HOLDER
- Sec. 207.151. SCOPE OF PRACTICE. (a) An anesthesiologist
- 14 assistant may assist the supervising anesthesiologist in
- 15 developing and implementing an anesthesia care plan for a patient
- 16 that is consistent with the rules adopted under this chapter.
- 17 (b) An anesthesiologist assistant who assists an
- 18 anesthesiologist is not considered to be engaged in the practice of
- 19 medicine.
- 20 (c) This chapter does not limit or expand the scope of
- 21 practice of a physician assistant.
- Sec. 207.152. USE OF TITLE. (a) A person may not use the
- 23 title "anesthesiologist assistant" or represent that the person is
- 24 an anesthesiologist assistant unless the person holds a license
- 25 <u>issued under this chapter.</u> A person who violates this subsection is
- 26 subject to an administrative penalty in an amount to be determined
- 27 by the medical board.

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- 1 (b) A student in an anesthesiologist assistant training
- 2 program shall be identified as a student anesthesiologist assistant
- 3 or an anesthesiologist assistant student. A student may not use or
- 4 permit to be used on the student's behalf the term "intern,"
- 5 "resident," or "fellow," or another term that identifies the
- 6 student as a physician or surgeon.
- 7 SECTION 2. Not later than June 1, 2016, the Texas Medical
- 8 Board shall adopt the rules, procedures, and fees necessary to
- 9 administer Chapter 207, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 10 SECTION 3. Notwithstanding Chapter 207, Occupations Code,
- 11 as added by this Act, an anesthesiologist assistant is not required
- 12 to hold a license under that chapter to practice as an
- 13 anesthesiologist assistant in this state before September 1, 2016.
- 14 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 15 section, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
- 16 (b) Sections 207.054, 207.101, and 207.152, Occupations
- 17 Code, as added by this Act, take effect September 1, 2016.
