13	(2) positive behavioral interventions and supports,

18	(n) An officer shall complete the program under Subsection
19	(m) not later than the second anniversary of the date the officer is
20	licensed under this chapter or the date the officer applies for an
21	intermediate proficiency certificate, whichever date is earlier.
22	SECTION 2. Section 1701.402, Occupations Code, is amended
23	by adding Subsection (m) to read as follows:
24	(m) As a requirement for an intermediate or advanced

proficiency certificate, an officer must complete an education and training program on techniques to facilitate interaction with children, adolescents, and teenagers under Section 1701.253(m).

4 SECTION 3. Not later than March 31, 2016, the Texas 5 Commission on Law Enforcement shall approve the curriculum for the 6 education and training program described by Section 1701.253(m), 7 Occupations Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 4. Notwithstanding 8 Section 1701.253(n), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, an officer licensed under 9 Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, on the effective date of this Act 10 must complete the education and training program described by 11 Section 1701.253(m), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not 12 later than March 31, 2018, as a condition for continuing to hold the 13 14 license.
