A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the security of the electric grid.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. (a) The Electric Grid Security Advisory
- 5 Committee is created. The committee is composed of the following
- 6 members:
- 7 (1) two members appointed by the governor;
- 8 (2) two members appointed by the lieutenant governor;
- 9 and
- 10 (3) two members appointed by the speaker of the house
- 11 of representatives.
- 12 (b) The governor shall designate a member of the committee
- 13 to serve as presiding officer.
- 14 (c) The committee shall convene at the call of the presiding
- 15 officer.
- 16 (d) The committee shall study the Texas electric grid and
- 17 the computer systems and networks related to it. The study must:
- 18 (1) evaluate and summarize the current state of the
- 19 electric grid and associated computer systems and networks;
- 20 (2) consider potential security threats to the
- 21 electric grid and associated computer systems and networks;
- 22 (3) assess whether further efforts are needed to
- 23 secure the electric grid and associated computer systems and
- 24 networks against damage, including the threat of electromagnetic

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- 1 pulse or other attacks and natural threats, including solar flares;
- 2 and
- 3 (4) recommend measures to secure the electric grid and
- 4 associated computer systems and networks against damage.
- 5 (e) The committee may share its findings with any state
- 6 agency it considers important to the security of the electric grid
- 7 or associated computer systems or networks. To the extent allowed
- 8 by law, a state agency with which the committee shares information
- 9 is encouraged to implement any recommendations that the agency
- 10 determines will improve the security of the state's electric grid
- 11 or associated computer systems or networks.
- 12 (f) ERCOT shall cooperate with the committee to provide any
- 13 information and resources the committee considers important to the
- 14 study.
- 15 (g) A member of the committee is not entitled to
- 16 compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the member's
- 17 travel expenses as provided by Chapter 660, Government Code, and
- 18 the General Appropriations Act.
- 19 (h) A vacancy on the task force shall be filled for the
- 20 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 21 (i) The committee is not subject to Chapter 2110, Government
- 22 Code.
- 23 (j) Not later than December 1, 2016, the committee shall
- 24 prepare a report of its findings, including any recommendations for
- 25 legislation resulting from the findings, and shall submit the
- 26 report to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of
- 27 the house of representatives.

- 1 (k) The committee's work relates to sensitive matters of
- 2 security. Notwithstanding any other law, the meetings, work, and
- 3 findings of the committee are not subject to the requirements of
- 4 Chapter 551 or 552, Government Code.
- 5 (1) The committee is abolished and this section expires on
- 6 December 31, 2016.
- 7 SECTION 2. Subchapter Z, Chapter 39, Utilities Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 39.917 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 39.917. INFORMATION RELATED TO GRID SECURITY. The
- 10 independent organization certified under Section 39.151 shall
- 11 collect and compile information related to the security of the
- 12 electric grid. The information is confidential and is not subject
- 13 to disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.
- 14 SECTION 3. The governor, the lieutenant governor, and the
- 15 speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint members to
- 16 the Electric Grid Security Advisory Committee, as required by this
- 17 Act, as soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act,
- 18 but not later than the 120th day after the effective date of this
- 19 Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
