- 1 immediately before the effective date of this Act, is dismissed;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) a hair braiding specialty certificate issued under
- 4 former Section 1601.259 or 1602.258, Occupations Code, expires.
- 5 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 6 Act, the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation shall issue a
- 7 prorated refund of any fees paid by a holder of a hair braiding
- 8 specialty certificate under former Section 1601.259 or 1602.258,
- 9 Occupations Code, that was scheduled to expire after the effective
- 10 date of this Act.
- 11 (c) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
- 12 Act, the Texas Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall repeal
- 13 all rules regarding the regulation of hair braiding and the
- 14 teaching of hair braiding.
- 15 SECTION 17. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
