3	health professionals.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 61, Education Code, is amended by adding
6	Subchapter K to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER K. REPAYMENT OF CERTAIN MENTAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL
8	EDUCATION LOANS
9	Sec. 61.601. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "mental
10	health professional" means:
11	(1) a licensed physician who is certified in
12	psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology;
13	(2) a psychologist, as defined by Section 501.002,
14	Occupations Code;
15	(3) a licensed professional counselor, as defined by
16	Section 503.002, Occupations Code;
17	(4) an advanced practice registered nurse, as defined
18	by Section 301.152, Occupations Code, who holds a nationally
19	recognized board certification in psychiatric or mental health
20	nursing; and
21	(5) a licensed clinical social worker, as defined by
22	Section 505.002, Occupations Code.
23	Sec. 61.602. REPAYMENT AUTHORIZED. The board shall
24	establish a program to provide, using funds appropriated for that

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purpose and in accordance with this subchapter and rules of the 1 2 board, assistance in the repayment of student loans for mental health professionals who apply and qualify for the assistance. 3 4 Sec. 61.603. ELIGIBILITY. To be eligible to receive 5 repayment assistance under this subchapter, a mental health professional must: 6 7 apply to the board; 8 (2) have completed one, two, three, four, or five consecutive years of practice in a health professional shortage 9 area designated by the Department of State Health Services; and 10 (3) provide mental health services in this state to: 11 12 (A) recipients under the medical assistance program authorized by Chapter 32, Human Resources Code; 13 14 (B) enrollees under the child health plan program 15 authorized by Chapter 62, Health and Safety Code; or 16 (C) persons committed to a secure correctional 17 facility operated by or under contract with the Texas Juvenile Justice Department or persons confined in a secure correctional 18 19 facility operated by or under contract with any division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. 20 21 Sec. 61.604. LIMITATIONS. (a) A mental health professional may receive repayment assistance under this 22 23 subchapter for not more than five years. 24 (b) Not more than 10 percent of the number of repayment assistance grants paid under this subchapter each year may be 25 26 awarded to mental health professionals providing mental health services described by Section 61.603(3)(C). 27

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1	(c) Not more than 30 percent of the number of repayment
2	assistance grants paid under this subchapter each year may be
3	awarded to mental health professionals in any one of the
4	professions listed in Section 61.601.
5	Sec. 61.605. ELIGIBLE LOANS. (a) The board may provide
6	repayment assistance under this subchapter for the repayment of any
7	student loan for education at an institution of higher education, a
8	private or independent institution of higher education, or a public
9	or private out-of-state institution of higher education accredited
10	by a recognized accrediting agency, including loans for
11	undergraduate education, received by an eligible person through any
12	lender.
13	(b) The board may not provide repayment assistance for a
14	student loan that is in default at the time of the person's
15	application.
16	(c) In each state fiscal biennium, the board shall attempt
17	to allocate all funds appropriated to the board for the purpose of
18	providing loan repayment assistance under this subchapter.
19	Sec. 61.606. REPAYMENT. (a) The board shall deliver any
20	repayment under this subchapter in a lump sum payable:
21	(1) to both the lender or other holder of the loan and
22	the mental health professional; or
23	(2) directly to the lender or other holder of the loan
24	on the mental health professional's behalf.
25	(b) A repayment under this subchapter may be applied to any
26	amount due in connection with the loan.
27	Sec. 61.607. AMOUNT OF REPAYMENT ASSISTANCE. (a) A mental

No. 2434 health professional may receive repayment assistance under this 1 subchapter for each year the mental health professional establishes 2 eligibility for the assistance in an amount determined by applying 3 the following applicable percentage to the maximum total amount of 4 5 assistance allowed for the mental health professional under Subsection (b): 6 7 (1) for the first year, 10 percent; 8 (2) for the second year, 15 percent; 9 (3) for the third year, 20 percent; (4) for the fourth year, 25 percent; and 10 (5) for the fifth year, 30 percent. 11 12 (b) The total amount of repayment assistance received by a mental health professional under this subchapter may not exceed: 13 (1) \$160,000, for assistance received by a licensed 14 15 physician; 16 (2) \$80,000, for assistance received by a 17 psychologist, a licensed professional counselor, or an advanced practice registered nurse; and 18 19 (3) \$40,000, for assistance received by a licensed clinical social worker. 20 21 (c) The total amount of repayment assistance provided under 22 this subchapter may not exceed the sum of: (1) the total amount of gifts and grants accepted by 23 24 the board for the repayment assistance; 25 (2) legislative appropriations for the repayment 26 assistance; and 27 (3) other funds available to the board for the

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1 repayment assistance.

2 <u>(d) The board may adjust in an equitable manner the</u> 3 <u>distribution amounts that mental health professionals would</u> 4 <u>otherwise receive under Subsection (a) for a year as necessary to</u> 5 <u>comply with Subsection (c).</u>

6 <u>Sec. 61.608. RULES. (a) The board shall adopt rules</u> 7 <u>necessary to administer this subchapter.</u>

8 (b) The board shall distribute to each institution of higher 9 education or private or independent institution of higher education 10 and to any appropriate state agency and professional association 11 copies of the rules adopted under this section and other pertinent 12 information relating to this subchapter.

Sec. 61.609. SOLICITATION AND ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS. The board may solicit and accept gifts and grants from any public or private source for the purposes of this subchapter.

16 SECTION 2. The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 17 shall adopt the rules for repayment assistance under Subchapter K, 18 Chapter 61, Education Code, as added by this Act, not later than 19 December 1, 2015.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.

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
