16	person's retirement or death to another person who:
17	(1) is related within the second degree by
18	consanguinity to the transferor; and
19	(2) holds a license as a journeyman plumber or master
20	plumber under this chapter.
21	(b) The application for a license transfer under this
22	section must include the transferor's consent and a designation of
23	whether the license will transfer on the retirement or death of the
24	transferor.

(c) The board shall transfer a license to a person who 1 2 submits an application and presents evidence satisfactory to the 3 board that: 4 (1) the person meets the requirements under Subsections (a)(1) and (a)(2); and 5 6 (2) the transferor is retired or dead. 7 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date 8 of this Act, the Texas State Board of Plumbing Examiners shall adopt 9 rules and prescribe forms necessary to implement the changes in law made by Section 1301.406, Occupations Code, as added by this Act. 10 SECTION 4. Not later than January 1, 2016, the Texas State 11 Board of Plumbing Examiners shall begin accepting applications for 12 the transfer of licenses under Section 1301.406, Occupations Code, 13 14 as added by this Act. 15 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
