A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to requirements for and the transparency of
- 3 epidemiological reports and immunization exemption information and
- 4 reports.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 81.047, Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 81.047. EPIDEMIOLOGICAL REPORTS. (a) Subject to the
- 9 confidentiality requirements of this chapter, the department shall
- 10 require epidemiological reports of disease outbreaks and of
- 11 individual cases of disease suspected or known to be of importance
- 12 to the public health, including vaccine preventable diseases. The
- 13 department shall evaluate the reports to determine the trends
- 14 involved and the nature and magnitude of the hazards.
- 15 (b) The department shall prepare and submit to the
- 16 legislature and the governor not later than December 1 of each
- 17 even-numbered year a biennial report that contains:
- 18 (1) a report of outbreaks of vaccine preventable
- 19 diseases in this state; and
- 20 (2) de-identified immunization exemption information,
- 21 including the number of persons claiming an exemption from the
- 22 immunization requirements of Section 161.004 of this code, Sections
- 23 38.001, 51.9192, and 51.933, Education Code, and Section 42.043,
- 24 Human Resources Code.

- 1 SECTION 2. Section 38.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (d), (e),
- 3 and (f) to read as follows:
- 4 (a) Each public school shall keep an individual
- 5 immunization record during the period of attendance for each
- 6 student admitted. The records shall be open for inspection at all
- 7 reasonable times by the Texas Education Agency or by
- 8 representatives of local health departments or the [Texas]
- 9 Department of State Health Services.
- 10 (c) The Texas Education Agency and the [Texas] Department of
- 11 State Health Services shall develop the form for a required annual
- 12 report of the immunization status of students that includes
- 13 <u>de-identified immunization exemption information</u>. The report
- 14 shall be submitted by all schools at the time and in the manner
- 15 indicated in the instructions printed on the form.
- 16 (d) Each school district shall provide to the Department of
- 17 State Health Services the information required by Subsection (c)
- 18 for the district as a whole and for each school campus in the
- 19 district.
- 20 <u>(e) The Department of State Health Services shall make</u>
- 21 <u>available to the public in electronic form, on the department's</u>
- 22 Internet website, the required annual report of the immunization
- 23 status of students for each school district and for each school
- 24 campus, submitted under Subsection (c).
- 25 (f) On request of a student's parent or legal guardian, a
- 26 school district or school campus shall provide to the parent or
- 27 guardian a copy of the following information for the campus at which

- 1 the student is enrolled:
- 2 (1) the immunization rate disaggregated by type of
- 3 <u>vaccine; and</u>
- 4 (2) the information submitted under Subsection (c),
- 5 including:
- 6 (A) de-identified immunization exemption
- 7 <u>information;</u>
- 8 (B) the number of students provisionally
- 9 enrolled pending documentation of immunization;
- 10 <u>(C)</u> the number of students claiming an exemption
- 11 for reasons of conscience, including a religious belief;
- 12 (D) the number of students claiming an exemption
- 13 for a medical reason; and
- 14 (E) the number of students whose vaccinations are
- 15 <u>not current.</u>
- SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 17 of this Act, the Texas Education Agency shall update the form
- 18 required by Section 38.002(c), Education Code, as amended by this
- 19 Act, to comply with that section and Section 38.002(d), Education
- 20 Code, as added by this Act.
- 21 SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 22 school year.
- 23 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
