- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 1802.001, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subdivisions (1), (5), and (10) and adding Subdivision
- (2) to read as follows: 8
- (1) "Advisory board" means the Auctioneer [Education] 9
- Advisory Board. 10
- 11 (2) "Associate auctioneer" means an individual who,
- 12 for compensation, is employed by and under the direct supervision
- of a licensed auctioneer to sell or offer to sell property at an 13
- auction. 14

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- (5) "Auctioneer" means any individual [person] who[+ 15
- 16  $[\frac{(A)}{A}]$  sells or offers to sell property of another
- person by live bid at auction, with or without receiving 17
- consideration[; or 18
- [(B) solicits, negotiates, 19
- 20 auction listing contract].
- 21 "Personal property" means any property other than
- real property[, including all tangible and intangible types of 22
- 23 property].
- SECTION 2. Section 1802.002(a), Occupations 24 Code, is

- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (a) This chapter does not apply to:
- 3 (1) a sale conducted by order of a United States court
- 4 under Title 11, United States Code;
- 5 (2) a sale conducted by an employee of the United
- 6 States, this state, or a political subdivision of this state in the
- 7 course and scope of employment;
- 8 (3) a sale conducted by a charitable, religious, or
- 9 civic organization, including an organization having a tax exempt
- 10 status under Section 501(c), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or
- 11 organized as a nonprofit entity, if the person organizing,
- 12 arranging, or conducting the auction receives no compensation;
- 13 (4) [a sale conducted by any person of the person's
- 14 property if the person is not engaged in the business of selling
- 15 property at auction on a recurring basis;
- 16  $\left[\frac{(5)}{}\right]$  a foreclosure sale of real property personally
- 17 conducted by a trustee under a deed of trust;
- (5) [<del>(6)</del>] a foreclosure sale of personal property
- 19 personally conducted by:
- 20 (A) a person who holds a security interest in the

- 22 (B) an employee or agent of a person described by

- 4 training purposes as part of a course of study approved by the

- (8) (9) an auction conducted by a posted stockyard
- 7 or market agency as defined by the federal Packers and Stockyards
- 8 Act (7 U.S.C. Section 181 et seq.), as amended;
- 9 (9) [<del>(10)</del>] an auction of livestock conducted by a
- 10 nonprofit livestock trade association chartered in this state, if
- 11 the auction involves only the sale of livestock owned by members of
- 12 the trade association;
- (10)  $[\frac{(11)}{(11)}]$  an auction conducted by a charitable or
- 14 nonprofit organization chartered in this state, if the auction:
- 15 (A) is part of a fair that is organized under
- 16 state, county, or municipal authority; and
- 17 (B) involves only the sale of property owned by
- 18 the organization's members; [or]
- (11)  $[\frac{(12)}{]}$  a sale or auction conducted by an
- 20 <u>auctioneer while the auctioneer is physically located</u> outside of
- 21 this state<u>;</u>
- 22 (12) a sale of motor vehicles at auction by a person
- 23 <u>licensed under Chapter 2301 or 2302;</u>
- 24 (13) a sale of motor vehicles at auction by a person
- 25 who holds a wholesale motor vehicle auction general distinguishing
- 26 number or an independent motor vehicle general distinguishing
- 27 number issued by the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles; or

- 1 (14) an auction of property through the Internet.
- 2 SECTION 3. Section 1802.051, Occupations Code, is amended
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 1802.051. LICENSE REQUIRED. (a) A person may not act
- 5 as an auctioneer or associate auctioneer [of real or personal
- 6 property] in this state unless the person holds a license issued by
- 7 the executive director under this chapter.
- 8 (b) A person [An auctioneer] who advertises to conduct an
- 9 auction in this state shall provide the [auctioneer's] name and
- 10 license number of the auctioneer who will conduct the auction in the
- 11 advertisement.
- 12 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (d), an [An] individual
- 13 who is licensed under this chapter may not act as an auctioneer for
- 14 an entity unless the entity[+
- 15  $\left[\frac{(1)}{(1)}\right]$  is an auction company owned or operated by an
- 16 individual who is licensed under this chapter[+
- 17 [(2) holds a dealer general distinguishing number
- 18 issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 503, Transportation Code, and
- 19 the auction is for the purpose of auctioning vehicles as defined by
- 20 Section 503.001, Transportation Code; or
- 21 [(3) is a real estate brokerage firm that is operated
- 22 by a broker licensed by the Texas Real Estate Commission].
- 23 (d) An individual who is licensed under this chapter may
- 24 only conduct an auction to sell motor vehicles, as defined by
- 25 <u>Section 502.001</u>, <u>Transportation Code</u>, if the license holder
- 26 conducts the auction for a person who holds a dealer general
- 27 distinguishing number issued under Subchapter B, Chapter 503,

- 1 Transportation Code.
- 2 SECTION 4. Section 1802.052(a), Occupations Code, is
- 3 amended to read as follows:
- 4 (a) An individual is eligible for an auctioneer's license if
- 5 the individual:
- 6 (1) is at least 18 years of age;
- 7 (2) is a citizen of the United States or a legal alien;
- 8 (3) either:
- 9 (A) passes a written or oral examination
- 10 demonstrating knowledge of the auction business and of the laws of
- 11 this state relating to the auction business; or
- 12 <u>(B) shows proof of employment by a licensed</u>
- 13 <u>auctioneer for at least two years and participation in at least 10</u>
- 14 auctions during that employment;
- 15 (4) holds a high school diploma or a high school
- 16 equivalency certificate;
- 17 (5) has not been convicted of a felony during the five
- 18 years preceding the date of application; and
- 19 (6) has completed at least 80 hours of classroom
- 20 instruction at an auction school with a curriculum approved by the
- 21 department in accordance with the standards and procedures
- 22 established by rule adopted under this chapter.
- SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 1802, Occupations Code, is
- 24 amended by adding Section 1802.053 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1802.053. ELIGIBILITY FOR ASSOCIATE AUCTIONEER
- 26 LICENSE. An individual is eligible for an associate auctioneer
- 27 license if the individual is:

- 1 (1) a citizen of the United States or a legal alien;
- 2 and
- 3 (2) employed under the direct supervision of an
- 4 <u>auctioneer licensed under this chapter.</u>
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 1802.054, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 1802.054. APPLICATION FOR LICENSE. An applicant for a
- 8 license must apply to the executive director on a form provided by
- 9 the executive director that establishes the applicant's
- 10 eligibility for the license. The application must be accompanied
- 11 by:
- 12 (1) any fee required for the auctioneer education and
- 13 recovery fund authorized under Section 1802.153;
- 14 (2) the required application [license] fee; and
- 15 (3) either:
- 16 (A) the permit number of a sales tax permit
- 17 issued to the applicant by the comptroller under Subchapter F,
- 18 Chapter 151, Tax Code; or
- 19 (B) proof of exemption from the tax permit
- 20 requirement under Chapter 151, Tax Code.
- 21 SECTION 7. Section 1802.055, Occupations Code, is amended
- 22 to read as follows:
- Sec. 1802.055. APPLICATION FOR EXAMINATION.  $\left[\frac{a}{a}\right]$  An
- 24 individual who establishes that the individual is eligible for an
- 25 auctioneer's license may apply to the executive director to take
- 26 the license examination. The application must be accompanied by
- 27 the application [examination] fee.

- 1 [(b) On receipt of an examination application and fee, the
- 2 executive director shall furnish the applicant with:
- 3 [(1) study materials and references on which the
- 4 examination will be based; and
- 5 [(2) a schedule specifying the dates and places the
- 6 examination will be offered.
- 7 [(c) The applicant may take the examination at any scheduled
- 8 offering not later than the 90th day after the date the applicant
- 9 receives the study materials.
- 10 SECTION 8. Section 1802.059(b), Occupations Code, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 (b) The executive director shall accept the applicant's
- 13 auctioneer's license submitted under Subsection (a)(2) as proof of
- 14 the applicant's professional competence and waive the examination
- 15 or employment and training requirements of Section 1802.052 if the
- 16 state or political subdivision that issued the nonresident a
- 17 license extends similar recognition and courtesies to this state.
- 18 SECTION 9. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 1802,
- 19 Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 20 SUBCHAPTER C. AUCTIONEER [EDUCATION] ADVISORY BOARD
- 21 SECTION 10. The heading to Section 1802.101, Occupations

- SECTION 11. Section 1802.106, Occupations Code, is amended

- 4 SECTION 12. Section 1802.107, Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Sec. 1802.107. MEETINGS. [(a) The advisory board shall
- 7 meet at least quarterly each calendar year.
- 8 [\(\frac{(b)}{at}\)] The advisory board shall [\(\frac{may}{ay}\)] meet [\(\frac{at other times}{at}\)]
- 9 at the call of the presiding officer of the commission or the
- 10 executive director.
- 11 SECTION 13. Section 1802.001(12), Occupations Code, is
- 12 repealed.
- SECTION 14. Not later than March 1, 2016, the Texas
- 14 Commission of Licensing and Regulation shall adopt rules necessary
- 15 to implement the changes in law made by this Act.
- 16 SECTION 15. (a) Notwithstanding Chapter 1802, Occupations
- 17 Code, as amended by this Act, a person is not required to hold a
- 18 license issued under that chapter to act as an associate auctioneer
- 19 until March 1, 2016.
- 20 (b) An individual who was licensed by the Texas Department
- 21 of Licensing and Regulation as an associate auctioneer on or before
- 22 June 14, 2013, may apply the individual's work experience
- 23 participating in auctions as an associate auctioneer on or before
- 24 June 14, 2013, toward the individual's eligibility for an
- 25 auctioneer's license under Chapter 1802, Occupations Code.
- 26 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
