A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the establishment of the Texas Promise Scholarship
3	Program for certain students at two-year public institutions of
4	higher education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 56, Education Code, is amended by adding
7	Subchapter T to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER T. TEXAS PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM
9	Sec. 56.521. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Coordinating board" means the Texas Higher
11	Education Coordinating Board.
12	(2) "Eligible institution" means:
13	(A) a public junior college;
14	(B) a public technical institute; or
15	(C) a public state college.
16	(3) "Institution of higher education," "public junior
17	college," "public technical institute," and "public state college"
18	have the meanings assigned by Section 61.003.
19	(4) "Program" means the Texas Promise Scholarship
20	Program established under this subchapter.
21	Sec. 56.522. PROGRAM PURPOSE. The purpose of the Texas
22	Promise Scholarship Program is to provide assistance in the payment
23	of tuition and mandatory fees to enable eligible students to attend
24	two-year institutions of higher education.

- 1 Sec. 56.523. ADMINISTRATION OF PROGRAM; AWARD OF
- 2 SCHOLARSHIP. (a) The coordinating board shall administer the
- 3 program and adopt any rules necessary to implement the program or
- 4 this subchapter. The coordinating board shall consult with the
- 5 student financial aid officers of eligible institutions in
- 6 developing the rules.
- 7 (b) The coordinating board shall award scholarships to
- 8 eligible students under the program. In determining who should
- 9 receive <u>a scholarship under the program, the coordinating board</u>
- 10 shall give highest priority to awarding scholarships to students
- 11 who demonstrate the greatest financial need.
- 12 (c) An eligible institution shall provide to a student who
- 13 receives a scholarship under the program for a semester or other
- 14 academic term a credit in the amount of the scholarship, to be
- 15 applied toward the payment of tuition and mandatory fees charged by
- 16 the institution for that semester or term.
- 17 Sec. 56.524. INITIAL ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOLARSHIP. (a) To
- 18 be eligible initially for a scholarship under the program, a person
- 19 must:
- 20 (1) be a resident of this state as determined by
- 21 coordinating board rules;
- (2) meet financial need requirements as defined by the
- 23 coordinating board;
- 24 (3) be enrolled in an associate degree or certificate
- 25 program at an eligible institution;
- 26 (4) be enrolled as an entering student for at least
- 27 one-half of a full course load for an entering student in the

- 1 associate degree or certificate program, as determined by the
- 2 coordinating board;
- 3 (5) have applied for any available financial aid or
- 4 assistance; and
- 5 (6) comply with any additional nonacademic
- 6 requirement adopted by the coordinating board under this
- 7 <u>subchapter</u>.
- 8 (b) A person is not eligible to receive a scholarship under
- 9 the program if the person has been convicted of a felony or an
- 10 offense under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code (Texas Controlled
- 11 Substances Act), or under the law of another jurisdiction involving
- 12 a controlled substance as defined by Chapter 481, Health and Safety
- 13 Code, unless the person has met the other applicable eligibility
- 14 requirements under the program and has:
- 15 (1) received a certificate of discharge by the Texas
- 16 Department of Criminal Justice or a correctional facility or
- 17 completed a period of probation ordered by a court, and at least two
- 18 years have elapsed from the date of the receipt or completion; or
- 19 (2) been pardoned, had the record of the offense
- 20 expunged from the person's record, or otherwise been released from
- 21 the resulting ineligibility to receive a scholarship under the
- 22 program.
- 23 <u>(c) A person is not eligible to receive a scholarship under</u>
- 24 the program if the person has been granted an associate or
- 25 baccalaureate degree.
- 26 (d) A person may not receive a scholarship under the program
- 27 for more than 75 semester credit hours or the equivalent.

- 1 (e) A person's eligibility for a scholarship under the
- 2 program ends on the third anniversary of the initial award of a
- 3 scholarship under the program to the person and the person's
- 4 enrollment in an eligible institution.
- 5 Sec. 56.525. CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC
- 6 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS. (a) After initially qualifying for a
- 7 scholarship under the program, a person may continue to receive a
- 8 scholarship under the program during each semester or term in which
- 9 the person is enrolled at an eligible institution only if the
- 10 person:
- 11 (1) meets financial need requirements as defined by
- 12 the coordinating board;
- 13 (2) is enr<u>olled in an associate degree or certificate</u>
- 14 program at an eligible institution;
- 15 (3) is enrolled for at least one-half of a full course
- 16 <u>load for a student in an associate degree or certificate program, as</u>
- 17 determined by the coordinating board;
- 18 (4) makes satisfactory academic progress toward an
- 19 associate degree or certificate; and
- 20 (5) complies with any additional nonacademic
- 21 requirement adopted by the coordinating board.
- (b) A person is not eligible to continue to receive a
- 23 scholarship under this section if the person has been convicted of a
- 24 felony or an offense under Chapter 481, Health and Safety Code
- 25 (Texas Controlled Substances Act), or under the law of another
- 26 jurisdiction involving a controlled substance as defined by Chapter
- 27 481, Health and Safety Code, unless the person has met the other

1 applicable eligibility requirements under this subchapter and has: 2 (1) received a certificate of discharge by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice or a correctional facility or 3 completed a period of probation ordered by a court, and at least two 4 5 years have elapsed from the date of the receipt or completion; or 6 (2) been pardoned, had the record of the offense 7 expunded from the person's record, or otherwise been released from the resulting ineligibility to receive a scholarship under the 8 program. 9 10 (c) If a person fails to meet any of the requirements of Subsection (a) after the completion of any semester or term, the 11 12 person may not receive a scholarship under the program during the next semester or term in which the person enrolls. A person may 13 14 become eligible to receive a scholarship under the program in a 15 subsequent semester or term if the person: 16 (1) completes a semester or term during which the 17 student is not eligible for a scholarship; and 18 (2) meets all the requirements of Subsection (a). 19 (d) For the purpose of this section, a person makes satisfactory academic progress toward an associate degree or 20 certificate only if: 21 (1) in the person's first academic year, the person 22 meets the satisfactory academic progress requirements of the 23 24 institution at which the person is enrolled; and 25 (2) in the subsequent academic year, the person:

credit hours attempted in the student's most recent academic year;

(A) completes at least 75 percent of the semester

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- 1 <u>and</u>
- 2 (B) has earned an overall grade point average of
- 3 at least 2.5 on a four-point scale or the equivalent on course work
- 4 previously attempted at institutions of higher education.
- 5 (e) A person who is eligible to receive a scholarship under
- 6 the program continues to remain eligible to receive the scholarship
- 7 <u>if the person enrolls in or transfers to another eligible</u>
- 8 institution.
- 9 (f) The coordinating board shall adopt rules to allow a
- 10 person who is otherwise eligible to receive a scholarship under the
- 11 program, in the event of a hardship or for other good cause shown,
- 12 including a showing of a severe illness or other debilitating
- 13 condition that may affect the person's academic performance or that
- 14 the person is responsible for the care of a sick, injured, or needy
- 15 person and that the person's provision of care may affect the
- 16 person's academic performance, to receive a scholarship under the
- 17 program:
- 18 (1) while enrolled in a number of semester credit
- 19 hours that is less than the number of semester credit hours required
- 20 under Subsection (a)(3); or
- 21 (2) if the student's grade point average or completion
- 22 rate falls below the satisfactory academic progress requirements of
- 23 <u>Subsection (d).</u>
- Sec. 56.526. SCHOLARSHIP USE. A scholarship awarded under
- 25 the program may be applied only to the payment of tuition and
- 26 mandatory fees at an eligible institution.
- Sec. 56.527. SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT. (a) The amount of a

- 1 scholarship awarded to an eligible student under the program for a
- 2 semester or other academic term in which the student is enrolled at
- 3 an eligible institution is an amount not to exceed the difference
- 4 between the amount of tuition and mandatory fees charged to the
- 5 student by the institution for that semester or term and the amount
- 6 of any other gift aid, including state or federal grants or
- 7 scholarships, awarded to the student for that semester or term.
- 8 (b) A scholarship may not be awarded under the program to an
- 9 eligible student for a semester or other academic term until any
- 10 other gift aid for which the student is eligible has been awarded to
- 11 the student and the student's unmet financial need has been
- 12 established for purposes of determining the appropriate amount of
- 13 the student's scholarship under Subsection (a).
- 14 (c) The coordinating board shall issue to each eligible
- 15 student a certificate indicating the amount of the scholarship
- 16 <u>awarded to the student.</u>
- 17 Sec. 56.528. NOTIFICATION OF PROGRAM; RESPONSIBILITIES OF
- 18 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. (a) The coordinating board, in consultation
- 19 with all eligible institutions, shall prepare materials designed to
- 20 inform prospective students, their parents, and high school
- 21 counselors about the program and eligibility for a scholarship
- 22 under the program. The coordinating board shall distribute to each
- 23 eligible institution and to each school district a copy of the
- 24 materials prepared under this section.
- 25 (b) Each school district shall notify its high school
- 26 students, those students' teachers and school counselors, and those
- 27 students' parents or guardians of the program and the eligibility

1 requirements of the program.

- 2 SECTION 2. (a) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 3 Board shall adopt rules to administer Subchapter T, Chapter 56,
- 4 Education Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable after
- 5 the effective date of this Act. For that purpose, the coordinating
- 6 board may adopt the initial rules in the manner provided by law for
- 7 emergency rules.
- 8 (b) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall
- 9 begin awarding scholarships under Subchapter T, Chapter 56,
- 10 Education Code, as added by this Act, for the first academic year
- 11 for which money is appropriated for that purpose, except that the
- 12 coordinating board may not award scholarships under that subchapter
- 13 for an academic year before the 2016-2017 academic year.
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
