## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a study on the effectiveness of regulations governing the design and construction of Type I municipal solid waste 3 landfills overlying aquifers. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. (a) In this Act: 6 7 (1)"Commission" means the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality. 8 "Landfill" means a Type I municipal solid waste 9 (2) landfill designed and constructed in accordance with regulatory 10 11 standards effective on or after October 9, 1993. 12 (b) The commission shall conduct a study to determine the 13 effectiveness of the regulations governing the design and 14 construction of landfills located over aquifers in this state. The study must: 15 (1)determine whether landfills located over aquifers 16 are leaking; 17 18 (2) based on a review of groundwater monitoring data collected and reported by statewide landfill operators and any 19 20 other relevant information, determine if any leakage from landfills 21 built over aquifers has seeped into or contaminated the aquifers underlying the landfills; 22 23 (3) include any recommendations necessary for 24 improving the effectiveness of the regulations governing the design

1 and construction of landfills located over aquifers, including 2 recommendations to:

3 (A) prevent or reduce leakage from landfills4 overlying aquifers; and

5 (B) protect aquifers underlying the landfills;6 and

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(4) be submitted for independent peer review.

8 (c) The commission may work with other state agencies, 9 institutions of higher education, nonprofit organizations, private 10 organizations, or business entities to conduct the study.

11 (d) Not later than January 1, 2017, the commission shall 12 submit a report on the results and recommendations of the study to 13 the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the house of 14 representatives, and the presiding officer of each standing 15 committee of the legislature with jurisdiction over environmental 16 matters.

(e) Applications and permits for Type I municipal solid
waste landfills may not be postponed or delayed pending the results
of the study.

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SECTION 2. This Act expires August 31, 2017.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
