5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Chapter 531, Government Code, is amended by
7	adding Subchapter M to read as follows:
8	SUBCHAPTER M. TASK FORCE ON FAMILY SUPPORT AND PARENT
9	EDUCATION PROGRAMS
10	Sec. 531.431. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "task force"
11	means the task force on family support and parent education
12	programs established under Section 531.432.
13	Sec. 531.432. ESTABLISHMENT OF TASK FORCE. The task force
14	on family support and parent education programs is established to
15	advise the executive commissioner regarding:
16	(1) the availability and quality of family support and
17	parent education programs in this state;
18	(2) expanding access in this state to family support
19	and parent education programs of varying degrees of intensity;
20	(3) using existing administrative and program data to
21	identify and evaluate gaps in family support and parent education
22	program curriculum and informing providers of family support and
23	parent education programs of those gaps and of underserved
24	geographic areas and populations;

No. 2550 (4) developing policy recommendations for family 1 2 support and parent education programs; (5) determining uniform desired outcomes for family 3 support and parent education programs and establishing 4 5 accountability standards relating to those outcomes; and (6) developing comprehensive statewide best practice 6 guidelines for family support and parent education programs. 7 Sec. 531.433. COMPOSITION OF TASK FORCE. The task force is 8 composed of 16 members appointed by the executive commissioner as 9 10 follows: (1) one representative of the commission; 11 12 (2) one representative of a school readiness 13 organization; 14 (3) one representative of a child abuse and neglect 15 prevention organization; (4) one representative of a parent education 16 17 organization; 18 (5) one representative of a mental health 19 organization; (6) one representative of The University of Texas 20 School of Public Health; 21 (7) one representative of the prevention and early 22 intervention program of the Department of Family and Protective 23 24 Services; 25 (8) one representative of the nurse-family 26 partnership program of the Department of State Health Services; (9) one university-based research professional who 27

3	(10) one provider of evidence-based family support and
4	parent education programs;
5	(11) one representative from the Texas Education
6	Agency;
7	(12) one representative of a faith-based
8	organization;

11	(14) one representative from the Texas State Advisory
12	Council on Early Childhood Education and Care;
13	(15) one representative of the business sector; and
14	(16) one representative of an organization that
15	invests in family support and parent education programs.
16	Sec. 531.434. PRESIDING OFFICER. The executive
17	commissioner shall appoint a member of the task force to serve as
18	presiding officer.
19	Sec. 531.435. VACANCY. A vacancy on the task force shall be
20	filled by appointment in the same manner as the original
21	appointment.
22	Sec. 531.436. MEETINGS. The task force shall meet at least
23	quarterly at the call of the presiding officer. The task force
24	shall meet at other times as determined by the presiding officer.
25	Sec. 531.437. DUTIES. (a) The task force shall:
26	(1) receive reports and testimony from individuals,
27	state and local governmental agencies, community-based

No. 2550 organizations, and other public and private organizations 1 2 regarding family support and parent education programs; (2) identify family support and parent education 3 programs that are being implemented in this state and describe for 4 5 each program: 6 (A) the scope of the program, both geographically 7 and in terms of content; 8 (B) whether the program is evidence-based; 9 (C) the effectiveness of the program; and 10 (D) the manner in which the program's effectiveness and outcomes are monitored; 11 12 (3) develop a comprehensive strategy for increasing access by parents in this state to evidence-based family support 13 and parent education programs of varying degrees of intensity; 14 15 (4) assess this state's compliance with: 16 (A) any applicable requirements that a family 17 support and parent education program in which a parent participates under a court order or at the request of the child protective 18 19 services division of the Department of Family and Protective Services be evidence-based; and 20 21 (B) state funding allocation requirements for 22 evidence-based family support and parent education programs; and (5) develop policy and other recommendations for: 23 24 (A) expanding evidence-based family support and parent education programs; and 25 26 (B) establishing comprehensive statewide best practice guidelines for family support and parent education 27

2	(b) In developing recommendations under Subsection (a)(5),
3	the task force shall include recommendations regarding:
4	(1) family support and parent education program
5	funding in this state;
6	(2) methods for using existing administrative and
7	program data to:
8	(A) identify populations in need of additional
9	services;
10	(B) identify long-term measures of program
11	effectiveness; and
12	(C) assess the performance of programs and
13	relevant state agencies; and
14	(3) appropriate programs for specific populations,
15	including:
16	(A) ethnic and racial minority populations; and
17	(B) families exhibiting both low and high levels
18	of risk factors, which include a preterm birth, poverty, having low
19	parent educational attainment, having one or more teenage parents,
20	having poor maternal health, and having parent unemployment or
21	underemployment.
22	Sec. 531.438. REPORT. (a) The task force shall prepare a
23	report that includes:
24	(1) a description of the activities of the task force;
25	(2) the findings and recommendations of the task
26	force, including recommendations described by Section
27	531.437(a)(5); and

1 (3) proposed legislation or recommendations or 2 information on any other relevant matter that the task force 3 considers appropriate. 4 (b) Not later than December 1, 2016, the task force shall 5 submit the report prepared under this section to the executive 6 commissioner, the governor, the lieutenant governor, the speaker of 7 the house of representatives, and the presiding officers of the standing committees of the senate and house of representatives 8 having primary jurisdiction over issues relating to family support 9 10 and parent education. Sec. 531.439. RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMMISSION. (a) 11 The 12 commission shall provide reasonably necessary administrative and technical support to the task force. 13 14 (b) The executive commissioner shall consider implementing 15 the recommendations of the task force. If the executive commissioner proposes to adopt or amend a rule as a result of the 16 17 recommendations of the task force, the executive commissioner shall seek input from the task force in developing the new or amended 18 19 rule. Sec. 531.440. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. Members of the 20 task force serve without compensation and may not be reimbursed for 21 travel or other expenses incurred while conducting the business of 22 23 the task force. 24 Sec. 531.441. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110 25 does not apply to the task force. Sec. 531.442. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The commission 26 may accept on behalf of the task force a gift, grant, or donation 27

## 1 from any source to carry out the purposes of this subchapter.

2 <u>Sec. 531.443. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and</u>
3 <u>this subchapter expires September 1, 2017.</u>

4 SECTION 2. The executive commissioner of the Health and 5 Human Services Commission shall appoint the members of the task 6 force on family support and parent education programs in accordance 7 with Subchapter M, Chapter 531, Government Code, as added by this 8 Act, as soon as possible after the effective date of this Act.

9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 10 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 11 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 12 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 13 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
