1 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to a violation of Section 27.01, Business & Commerce Code, that occurs 2 on or after the effective date of this Act. A violation of Section 3 4 27.01, Business & Commerce Code, that occurs before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the 5 violation occurred, and the former law is continued in effect for 6 that purpose. For purposes of this section, a violation occurs 7 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the 8 violation occurs before that date. 9
