A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the minimum number of minutes of instruction for
- 3 students to be provided by public school districts and the
- 4 scheduling of the last day of school for students by public school
- 5 districts.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 25.081, Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 25.081. OPERATION OF SCHOOLS. (a) Except as
- 10 authorized under Subsection (b) of this section, Section 25.084, or
- 11 Section 29.0821, for each school year each school district must
- 12 operate so that the district provides for at least 75,600 minutes
- 13 [180 days] of instruction, including intermissions and recesses,
- 14 for students.
- 15 (b) The commissioner may approve the instruction of
- 16 students for fewer than the number of <u>minutes</u> [days] required under
- 17 Subsection (a) if disaster, flood, extreme weather conditions, fuel
- 18 curtailment, or another calamity causes the closing of schools.
- 19 (c) If the commissioner does not approve reduced
- 20 instruction time under Subsection (b), a school district may add
- 21 additional minutes to the end of the district's normal school hours
- 22 <u>as necessary to compensate for minutes of instruction lost due to</u>
- 23 school closures caused by disaster, flood, extreme weather
- 24 conditions, fuel curtailment, or another calamity.

- 1 (d) The commissioner may adopt rules for the application, on
- 2 the basis of the minimum minutes of instruction required by
- 3 Subsection (a), of any provision of this title that refers to a
- 4 minimum number of days of instruction under this section.
- 5 SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 25, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 25.0812 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 25.0812. LAST DAY OF SCHOOL. (a) Except as provided
- 8 by Subsection (b), a school district may not schedule the last day
- 9 of school for students for a school year before May 15.
- 10 (b) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), a school district that
- 11 does not offer each grade level from kindergarten through grade 12
- 12 and whose prospective or former students generally attend school in
- 13 another state for the grade levels the district does not offer may
- 14 schedule the last day of school on any date permitted under
- 15 <u>Subsection (a) or the law of the other state.</u>
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2015-2016
- 17 school year.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
