A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 81.046, Health and Safety Code, is amended by amending Subsections (b), (c), and (f) and adding Subsections (c-1), (c-2), and (g) to read as follows: 1-22 1-23 1-24
