- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 37, Education Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 37.0812 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 37.0812. TRAINING POLICY: SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE
- 9 OFFICERS AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. A school district with an
- 10 enrollment of 30,000 or more students that commissions a school
- 11 <u>district peace officer or at which a school resource officer</u>
- 12 provides law enforcement shall adopt a policy requiring the officer
- 13 to complete the education and training program required by Section
- 14 1701.263, Occupations Code.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter F, Chapter 1701, Occupations Code, is
- 16 amended by adding Sections 1701.262 and 1701.263 to read as
- 17 follows:
- 18 Sec. 1701.262. TRAINING FOR SCHOOL DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS
- 19 AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. (a) In this section:
- 20 (1) "Center" means the Texas School Safety Center at
- 21 Texas State University.
- 22 (2) "Institute" means an institute dedicated to
- 23 providing training to law enforcement and the development of law
- 24 enforcement policies, such as the Law Enforcement Management

- 1 Institute of Texas at Sam Houston State University or the Caruth
- 2 Police Institute.
- 3 (3) "School district peace officer" means a peace
- 4 officer commissioned under Section 37.081, Education Code.
- 5 (4) "School resource officer" has the meaning assigned
- 6 by Section 1701.601.
- 7 (b) The commission, in consultation with an institute or the
- 8 center, shall create, adopt, and distribute a model training
- 9 curriculum for school district peace officers and school resource
- 10 <u>officers.</u>
- 11 (c) The curriculum developed under this section must
- 12 incorporate learning objectives regarding:
- 13 (1) child and adolescent development and psychology;
- 14 (2) positive behavioral interventions and supports,
- 15 conflict resolution techniques, and restorative justice
- 16 <u>techniques;</u>
- 17 (3) de-escalation techniques and techniques for
- 18 limiting the use of force, including the use of physical,
- 19 mechanical, and chemical restraints;
- 20 (4) the mental and behavioral health needs of children
- 21 with disabilities or special needs; and
- 22 <u>(5) mental health crisis intervention.</u>
- 23 <u>(d) Before adopting and distributing any curriculum under</u>
- 24 this section, the commission shall provide a 30-day period for
- 25 public comment.
- 26 (e) The commission shall provide the curriculum developed
- 27 under this section and any supplemental education materials created

3	(2) law enforcement agencies that place peace officers

6	(3) any entity that provides training to school
7	district peace officers or school resource officers.
8	(f) The commission shall review curriculum developed and
9	adopted under this section and update subject matter contained in
10	the curriculum as needed at least once every four years.
11	Sec. 1701.263. EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM FOR SCHOOL
12	DISTRICT PEACE OFFICERS AND SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS. (a) In this
13	section:
14	(1) "School district peace officer" has the meaning
15	assigned by Section 1701.262.
16	(2) "School resource officer" has the meaning assigned
17	by Section 1701.601.
18	(b) The commission by rule shall require a school district
19	peace officer or a school resource officer who is commissioned by or
20	who provides law enforcement at a school district with an
21	enrollment of 30,000 or more students to successfully complete an
22	education and training program described by this section before or
23	within 120 days of the officer's commission by or placement in the
24	district or a campus of the district. The program must:
25	(1) consist of at least 16 hours of training;
26	(2) be approved by the commission; and
27	(3) provide training in accordance with the curriculum

1 for the curriculum to:

- 1 developed under Section 1701.262 in each subject area listed in
- 2 Subsection (c) of that section.
- 3 (b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b) or a rule adopted
- 4 under that section, a school district peace officer or school
- 5 resource officer is not required to successfully complete the
- 6 education and training program required by this section if the
- 7 officer has successfully completed the advanced training course
- 8 conducted by the National Association of School Resource Officers
- 9 or a training course equivalent to that advanced training course,
- 10 as determined by the commission.
- 11 (c) The education and training program required under this
- 12 section may not require a peace officer to pass an examination,
- 13 except that the commission shall administer an examination to
- 14 qualify officers to provide the education and training to other
- 15 officers. The examination to qualify officers to provide the
- 16 <u>education</u> and training must test the officer's knowledge and
- 17 recognition of the subject areas listed in Section 1701.262(c).
- 18 (d) The commission shall issue a professional achievement
- 19 or proficiency certificate to a peace officer who completes the
- 20 education and training program under this section.
- 21 SECTION 3. (a) Not later than December 1, 2015, the Texas
- 22 Commission on Law Enforcement shall create the model training
- 23 curriculum for school district peace officers and school resource
- 24 officers required by Section 1701.262, Occupations Code, as added
- 25 by this Act.
- 26 (b) Not later than February 1, 2016, the Texas Commission on
- 27 Law Enforcement shall make available to school district peace

- 1 officers and school resource officers the training required by
- 2 Section 1701.263, Occupations Code, as added by this Act.
- 3 (c) Notwithstanding Section 1701.263(b), Occupations Code,
- 4 as added by this Act, a school district peace officer or school
- 5 resource officer who commences employment with or commences
- 6 providing law enforcement at a school district with an enrollment
- 7 of 30,000 or more students on a date occurring before February 1,
- 8 2016, shall complete the training required by Section 1701.263,
- 9 Occupations Code, as added by this Act, as soon as practicable and
- 10 not later than June 1, 2016. This subsection does not apply to an
- 11 officer who is exempt from the training established under Section
- 12 1701.263, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, because the
- 13 officer has completed the training described by Subsection (b-1) of
- 14 that section.
- 15 (d) Not later than February 1, 2016, a school district with
- 16 an enrollment of 30,000 or more students shall adopt the training
- 17 policy for school district peace officers and school resource
- 18 officers required by Section 37.0812, Education Code, as added by
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
