Section 105.001, Health and Safety Code, is amended by adding Subdivisions (3), (4), (5), and (6) to read as 1-24 1-25 follows: (3) "Freestanding emergency medical care facility" means a facility licensed under Chapter 254. 1-26 1-27 (4) "Home health agency" means a home and community 1-28 support services agency licensed under Chapter 142. 1-29 (5) "Hospital" means a general or special hospital licensed under Chapter 241, a private mental hospital licensed under Chapter 577, or a hospital that is maintained or operated by 1-30 1-31 1-32 this state or an agency of this state. 1-33 (6) "Nursing facility" means an institution licensed 1-34 under Chapter 242. STUDY ON WORKPLACE VIOLENCE AGAINST NURSES. 1-39 To the extent existing funding is available, the nursing (a) resource section established under Section 105.002 may conduct a 1-40 study on workplace violence against nurses in hos freestanding emergency medical care facilities, hospitals, 1-41 1-42 nursing facilities, and home health agencies. 2-12 (e) If the nursing resource section conducts a study under 2-13 this section, not later than December 1, 2016, the nursing resource 2-14 section shall complete the study and publish the study findings.
