(c) At the time of application for benefits described by

- 1 Subsection (b), an applicant must:
- 2 (1) be informed about and given the opportunity to
- 3 enroll in the program; and
- 4 (2) be informed that enrolling in the program will not
- 5 affect the person's eligibility for benefits.
- 6 (d) The commission shall develop a procedure under which
- 7 <u>faith- and community-based organizations may apply to participate</u>
- 8 in the program.
- 9 (e) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules to
- 10 implement the program established under this section, including
- 11 rules that:
- 12 (1) describe the types of faith- and community-based
