Section 1601.002, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 1601.002. DEFINITION OF BARBERING. In this chapter, 7 "barbering," "practicing barbering," or the "practice of 8 9 barbering" means: (1) performing or offering or attempting to perform 10 for compensation or the promise of compensation any of the 11 12 following services: 13 (A) treating a person's mustache or beard by 14 arranging, beautifying, coloring, processing, shaving, styling, or 15 trimming; 16 (B) treating a person's hair by: 17 (i) arranging, beautifying, bleaching, cleansing, coloring, curling, dressing, dyeing, processing, 18 [shampooing,] shaping, singeing, straightening, styling, tinting, 19 20 or waving; 21 (ii) providing a necessary service that is 22 preparatory or ancillary to a service under Subparagraph (i), 23 including bobbing, clipping, cutting, or trimming; or (iii) cutting the person's hair 24 as a

6 (a) A person who holds a license, certificate, or permit 7 issued under this chapter, Chapter 1601, or Chapter 1602 and who 8 performs a barbering service described by Section 1601.002(1)(E) or (F) or a cosmetology service described by Section 1602.002(a)(9) or 9 (10) [1602.002(a)(10) or (11)] shall, before performing the 10 service, clean, disinfect, and sterilize with an autoclave or dry 11 heat sterilizer or sanitize with an ultraviolet sanitizer, in 12 accordance with the sterilizer or sanitizer manufacturer's 13 instructions, each metal instrument, including metal 14 nail 15 clippers, cuticle pushers, cuticle nippers, and other metal instruments, used to perform the service. 16

SECTION 18. Sections 1601.261 and 1602.267, Occupations 18 Code, are repealed.

SECTION 19. On the effective date of this Act:

20 (1) a shampoo apprentice permit issued under former
21 Section 1601.261 or 1602.267, Occupations Code, expires; and

(2) a shampoo specialty certificate issued under23 Chapter 1602 expires.

SECTION 20. (a) The changes in law made by this Act do not affect the validity of a proceeding pending before a court or other governmental entity on the effective date of this Act.

27 (b) An offense or other violation of law committed before

1 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when 2 the offense or violation was committed, and the former law is 3 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this 4 subsection, an offense or violation was committed before the 5 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense or 6 violation occurred before that date.

7 SECTION 21. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
