16 SECTION 18. Sections 1601.261 and 1602.267, Occupations 17 Code, are repealed.

18 SECTION 19. On the effective date of this Act, a shampoo 19 apprentice permit issued under former Section 1601.261 or 1602.267, 20 Occupations Code, expires.

21 SECTION 20. (a) The changes in law made by this Act do not 22 affect the validity of a proceeding pending before a court or other 23 governmental entity on the effective date of this Act.

(b) An offense or other violation of law committed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the offense or violation was committed, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this

1 subsection, an offense or violation was committed before the 2 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense or 3 violation occurred before that date.
