A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the use of human remains for forensic science

- 3 education, including the training of search and rescue animals.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 691.0225, Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 691.0225. INFORMATIONAL DOCUMENT. The board shall
- 8 develop a document to inform a person making a gift of a decedent's
- 9 body or anatomical specimen for purposes of education, including
- 10 forensic science education, or research of the risks and benefits
- 11 associated with donation. The board shall make the document
- 12 available on the board's Internet website.
- SECTION 2. Section 691.023(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 14 amended to read as follows:
- 15 (a) An officer, employee, or representative of the state, of
- 16 a political subdivision, or of an institution having charge or
- 17 control of a body not claimed for burial or a body required to be
- 18 buried at public expense shall:
- 19 (1) notify the board or the board's representative of
- 20 the body's existence when the body comes into the person's
- 21 possession, charge, or control if notified in writing to do so by
- 22 the board or the board's representative;
- 23 (2) deliver the body in accordance with the direction
- 24 of the board; and

- 1 (3) allow the board, the board's representative, or a
- 2 physician designated by the board who complies with this chapter to
- 3 remove the body to be used for the advancement of medical $\underline{\text{or}}$
- 4 forensic science.
- 5 SECTION 3. Section 691.028(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) An adult living in this state who is of sound mind may
- 8 donate the adult's [his] body by will or other written instrument to
- 9 the board, a medical or dental school, or another donee authorized
- 10 by the board, to be used for the advancement of medical or forensic
- 11 science.
- 12 SECTION 4. Section 691.030(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 (a) The board or the board's representative shall
- 15 distribute bodies donated to it and may redistribute bodies donated
- 16 to medical or dental schools or other donees authorized by the board
- 17 to schools and colleges of chiropractic, osteopathy, medicine, or
- 18 dentistry incorporated in this state, to a forensic science
- 19 program, to physicians, and to other persons as provided by this
- 20 section.
- SECTION 5. Sections 691.033(a), (c), and (d), Health and
- 22 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 23 (a) To further medical or forensic science, a school,
- 24 college, or person designated by the board may use, dissect,
- 25 operate on, examine, and experiment on a body or anatomical
- 26 specimen distributed under this chapter.
- (c) A law relating to the prevention of mutilation of a body

- 1 does not apply to the use of a body as authorized under this section
- 2 or a dissection, operation, examination, or experiment performed
- 3 under this section.
- 4 (d) To aid prosecutions under Section 42.08, Penal Code, the
- 5 board shall adopt rules that clearly state the activities that are
- 6 authorized by the board in relation to the use or dissection of a
- 7 body.
- 8 SECTION 6. Sections 691.034(c) and (d), Health and Safety
- 9 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 10 (c) The board may suspend or revoke a person's or
- 11 institution's authorization to receive and <u>use or</u> dissect bodies or
- 12 anatomical specimens if the board determines that the person or
- 13 institution has improperly used a body or anatomical specimen.
- 14 (d) A person or institution is entitled to a hearing before
- 15 the board or a hearing examiner appointed by the board before the
- 16 board may revoke the person's or institution's authorization to
- 17 receive and use or dissect bodies or anatomical specimens. The
- 18 board shall make all final decisions to suspend or revoke an
- 19 authorization.
- SECTION 7. Section 692A.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 21 amended by adding Subdivision (11-a) to read as follows:
- 22 (11-a) "Education" with respect to the purposes
- 23 authorized by law for making an anatomical gift includes forensic
- 24 science education.
- 25 SECTION 8. Section 692A.011, Health and Safety Code, is
- 26 amended by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (c-1) to
- 27 read as follows:

- 1 (c) A forensic science program that receives a donation
- 2 under Subsection (a)(5) must submit a report to the Anatomical
- 3 Board of the State of Texas on a quarterly basis that lists:
- 4 (1) the number of bodies or parts of bodies that the
- 5 program received; [and]
- 6 (2) the method in which the program used the bodies or
- 7 parts of bodies for education or research; and
- 8 (3) the number of contracts the program has entered
- 9 into under Subsection (c-1), including the persons with whom the
- 10 program contracted and the persons' contact information, and the
- 11 number of bodies or parts of bodies provided under the contracts.
- 12 <u>(c-1)</u> A forensic science program in accordance with rules
- 13 <u>adopted by the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas may contract</u>
- 14 with a person who trains search and rescue animals to provide bodies
- or parts of bodies to the person in accordance with board rules and
- 16 this subtitle. The contract must require the person to use the
- 17 bodies and parts of bodies only to assist in the training of search
- 18 and rescue animals and to properly receive, handle, use, and
- 19 dispose of the bodies and parts of bodies in accordance with this
- 20 subtitle and rules adopted by the board.
- 21 SECTION 9. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 22 of this Act, the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas shall adopt
- 23 the rules necessary to implement the changes in law made by this Act
- 24 to Chapter 691, Health and Safety Code, and Section 692A.011,
- 25 Health and Safety Code.
- 26 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
