- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Section 552.1151 to read as follows:
- 8 Sec. 552.1151. CONFIDENTIALITY OF DATE OF BIRTH. (a) A
- 9 person's date of birth is confidential and not subject to
- 10 <u>disclosure under this chapter.</u>
- 11 (b) A governmental body may redact a person's date of birth
- 12 from any information the governmental body discloses under Section
- 13 <u>552.021</u> without the necessity of requesting a decision from the
- 14 attorney general under Subchapter G.
- 15 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, a county or district
- 16 clerk may disclose in the ordinary course of business a person's
- 17 date of birth that is contained in information held by the clerk's
- 18 office, and that disclosure is not official misconduct and does not
- 19 subject the clerk to civil or criminal liability of any kind under
- 20 the law of this state, including any claim for damages in a lawsuit
- 21 or the criminal penalty imposed by Section 552.352.
- SECTION 2. Section 552.1151, Government Code, as added by
- 23 this Act, applies to a request for information made before, on, or
- 24 after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

5 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
