| 8 | Sec. 403.501. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: |
| 9 | (1) "Asylum-seeking child" means a minor fleeing |
| 10 | Central America who is seeking asylum in the United States and who |
| 11 | has been released into a community in this state by: |
| 12 | (A) the Office of Refugee Resettlement; or |
| 13 | (B) United States Customs and Border Protection |

| 16 | (2) "Task force" means the task force on |

| 18 | Sec. 403.502. ESTABLISHMENT; PURPOSES. The task force on |
| 19 | asylum-seeking children is established to: |
| 20 | (1) study the humanitarian and fiscal impacts of the |
| 21 | <pre>presence of asylum-seeking children in this state related to:</pre> |
| 22 | (A) public education and school districts; and |
| 23 | (B) the provision of health and human services |

No. 2783 (2) produce a report outlining the status of 1 2 asylum-seeking children in this state and distribute that report to 3 state and federal officials. 4 Sec. 403.503. COMPOSITION. The task force is composed of 5 eight members to be appointed by the comptroller as follows: 6 (1) one representative of a faith-based organization 7 providing direct services to asylum-seeking children in this state; (2) one representative of a community-based 8 organization providing direct services to asylum-seeking children 9 10 in this state; (3) one member who is a superintendent of a school 11 12 district providing direct services to asylum-seeking children in 13 this state; 14 (4) one representative of a law enforcement agency; 15 (5) one representative of the Texas Education Agency; 16 (6) one representative of the Health and Human 17 Services Commission; 18 (7) one representative of the comptroller; and 19 (8) one representative of a foundation that invests in humanitarian relief efforts for asylum-seeking children in this 20 21 state. Sec. 403.504. MEETINGS. (a) The task force shall meet in 22
- 23 person at least three times each year and may hold additional
- 24 meetings in person or by conference call if necessary.
- (b) Section 551.125 applies to a meeting held by conference call under this section, except that Section 551.125(b) does not apply.

- 1 Sec. 403.505. COMPENSATION. A member of the task force may
- 2 not receive compensation for service on the task force.
- 3 Sec. 403.506. REPORT. (a) Using funds available to the
- 4 task force under Section 403.507, the task force shall partner with
- 5 an independent third party to produce a report outlining the status
- 6 of asylum-seeking children in this state.
- 7 (b) The task force shall submit the report to the governor,
- 8 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 9 comptroller. The task force shall also submit the report to the
- 10 president of the United States, the secretary of the United States
- 11 Department of Health and Human Services, the secretary of the
- 12 United States Department of Education, and each member of the Texas
- 13 delegation to the United States Senate and House of
- 14 Representatives.
- 15 Sec. 403.507. GIFTS, GRANTS, AND DONATIONS. The
- 16 comptroller may accept on behalf of the task force a gift, grant, or
- 17 donation from any source to carry out the purposes of this
- 18 subchapter. Notwithstanding any other provision of this
- 19 subchapter, the comptroller is not required to convene the task
- 20 force to produce the report if sufficient private gifts, grants, or
- 21 donations are not available.
- Sec. 403.508. EXPIRATION. The task force is abolished and
- 23 this subchapter expires December 31, 2016.
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 31, 2015, the
- 25 comptroller of public accounts shall, subject to Section 403.507,
- 26 Government Code, as added by this Act, convene the task force
- 27 required under Subchapter R, Chapter 403, Government Code, as added

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- 1 by this Act.
- 2 (b) If the comptroller of public accounts convenes the task
- 3 force under Subsection (a) of this section, not later than October
- 4 1, 2016, the task force shall submit the report required under
- 5 Subchapter R, Chapter 403, Government Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
