## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to a delayed birth certificate; providing a criminal
- 3 penalty.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 192.027(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) If a delayed birth certificate is not accepted for
- 8 registration by the state registrar, the person may file a petition
- 9 in the county probate court of the county in which the birth
- 10 occurred, or in the county probate court of the county in which the
- 11 person resides, for an order establishing a record of the person's
- 12 date of birth, place of birth, and parentage.
- SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 192, Health and Safety
- 14 Code, is amended by adding Sections 192.028 and 192.029 to read as
- 15 follows:
- Sec. 192.028. APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM. A judge of
- 17 <u>a county probate court may appoint an attorney ad litem in a</u>
- 18 proceeding under Section 192.027 to represent the interests of the
- 19 person seeking the delayed birth certificate.
- 20 <u>Sec. 192.029. REFUSAL TO SIGN AFFIDAVIT OF PERSONAL</u>
- 21 KNOWLEDGE. (a) A parent of a person who is seeking a delayed birth
- 22 <u>certificate under this subchapter shall sign an affidavit of</u>
- 23 personal knowledge acknowledging that the individual is the parent
- 24 of the person seeking the delayed birth certificate if:

- 1 (1) the person seeking a delayed birth certificate, a
- 2 managing conservator or guardian of the person, or, if the person is
- 3 a minor, another person with custody of the minor has requested the
- 4 person's parent to sign the affidavit of personal knowledge; and
- 5 (2) the parent's affidavit of personal knowledge is
- 6 necessary for the issuance of the birth certificate because the
- 7 person seeking the delayed birth certificate is unable to provide
- 8 sufficient alternative documentary evidence as required by Section
- 9 192.025.
- 10 (b) A parent shall sign an affidavit as described by
- 11 Subsection (a) not later than the 30th day after the date a request
- 12 is made as described by Subsection (a)(1).
- 13 (c) A person who is a parent of a person seeking a delayed
- 14 birth certificate and who fails to sign an affidavit of personal
- 15 knowledge as required by this section:
- 16 (1) commits an offense punishable as a Class B
- 17 misdemeanor if the request under Subsection (a)(1) is made on or
- 18 after the fourth anniversary of the date of birth but before the
- 19 15th anniversary of the date of birth; or
- 20 (2) commits an offense punishable as a Class A
- 21 misdemeanor if the request under Subsection (a)(1) is made on or
- 22 after the 15th anniversary of the date of birth.
- 23 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
