A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to a revision of the essential knowledge and skills of the
- 3 public school foundation curriculum, the instructional materials
- 4 allotment, and proclamations for the production of instructional
- 5 materials.

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- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 28.0025 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 28.0025. REVIEW AND REVISION OF ESSENTIAL KNOWLEDGE
- 10 AND SKILLS. (a) The State Board of Education shall:
- 11 (1) conduct a review of the essential knowledge and
- 12 skills for the foundation curriculum adopted under Section
- 13 <u>28.002(a)(1); and</u>
- 14 (2) revise the essential knowledge and skills for that
- 15 curriculum to narrow the number and scope of student expectations
- 16 for each subject and grade level in accordance with this section.
- 17 (b) The scope of the essential knowledge and skills for each
- 18 subject and grade level of the foundation curriculum must:
- 19 <u>(1) be more narrow than the scope of the essential</u>
- 20 knowledge and skills adopted as of January 1, 2015; and
- 21 (2) require less time for a demonstration of mastery
- 22 than required for the essential knowledge and skills adopted as of
- 23 January 1, 2015.
- 24 (c) In complying with this section, the State Board of

No. 2811 1 Education shall: 2 (1) ensure that a revision of the essential knowledge 3 and skills for the foundation curriculum does not result in a need for the adoption of new instructional materials; 4 5 (2) consider for each subject and grade level, the 6 time: 7 (A) a teacher would require to provide 8 comprehensive instruction on a particular student expectation; and (B) a typical student would require to master a 9 10 particular student expectation; (3) determine whether, in light of the consideration 11 12 required by Subdivision (2), each essential knowledge and skill of a subject can be comprehensively taught within the number of school 13 days required under Section 25.081, not including the number of 14 15 days required for testing; 16 (4) determine whether the college and career readiness 17 standards have been appropriately integrated in the essential knowledge and skills for each subject and grade level; and 18 19 (5) consider whether an assessment administered under Section 39.023 adequately assesses a particular 20 21 student expectation. (d) Not later than September 1, 2018, the State Board of 22 Education shall complete the review and revision of the essential 23

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- 1 SECTION 2. Section 31.002, Education Code, is amended by
- 2 adding Subdivision (1-b) to read as follows:
- 3 (1-b) "Proclamation" means a request for production of
- 4 instructional materials issued by the State Board of Education.
- 5 SECTION 3. Sections 31.0211(a) and (d), Education Code, are
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (a) A school district is entitled to an [annual] allotment
- 8 <u>each biennium</u> from the state instructional materials fund for each
- 9 student enrolled in the district on a date during the last year of
- 10 the preceding biennium [school year] specified by the
- 11 commissioner. The commissioner shall determine the amount of the
- 12 allotment per student each biennium [year] on the basis of the
- 13 amount of money available in the state instructional materials fund
- 14 to fund the allotment. An allotment under this section shall be
- 15 transferred from the state instructional materials fund to the
- 16 credit of the district's instructional materials account as
- 17 provided by Section 31.0212.
- 18 (d) Each $\underline{\text{biennium}}$ [$\underline{\text{year}}$] a school district shall use the
- 19 district's allotment under this section to purchase, in the
- 20 following order:
- 21 (1) instructional materials necessary to permit the
- 22 district to certify that the district has instructional materials
- 23 that cover all elements of the essential knowledge and skills of the
- 24 required curriculum, other than physical education, for each grade
- 25 level as required by Section 28.002; and
- 26 (2) any other instructional materials or
- 27 technological equipment as determined by the district.

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- 1 SECTION 4. Section 31.0212(a), Education Code, is amended
- 2 to read as follows:
- 3 (a) The commissioner shall maintain an instructional
- 4 materials account for each school district. In the first year of
- 5 each biennium [Each school year], the commissioner shall deposit in
- 6 the account for each district the amount of the district's
- 7 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211.
- 8 SECTION 5. Sections 31.0215(a) and (b), Education Code, are
- 9 amended to read as follows:
- 10 (a) The commissioner shall, as early as practicable during
- 11 each <u>biennium</u> [<u>fiscal year</u>], notify each school district and
- 12 open-enrollment charter school of the estimated amount to which the
- 13 district or charter school will be entitled under Section 31.0211
- 14 during the next fiscal biennium [year].
- 15 (b) The commissioner may allow a school district or
- 16 open-enrollment charter school to place an order for instructional
- 17 materials before the beginning of a fiscal biennium [year] and to
- 18 receive instructional materials before payment. The commissioner
- 19 shall limit the cost of an order placed under this section to 80
- 20 percent of the estimated amount to which a school district or
- 21 open-enrollment charter school is estimated to be entitled as
- 22 provided by Subsection (a) and shall first credit any balance in a
- 23 district or charter school instructional materials account to pay
- 24 for an order placed under this section.
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 31.022, Education Code, is amended by
- 26 adding Subsections (b-1), (b-2), and (b-3) and amending Subsection
- 27 (f) to read as follows:

- 1 (b-1) For any state fiscal biennium, the board may only
- 2 issue proclamations for instructional materials in which the total
- 3 projected cost of instructional materials under the proclamations
- 4 does not exceed 75 percent of the total amount used to fund the
- 5 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211 for that
- 6 biennium.
- 7 (b-2) Following the adoption of revised essential knowledge
- 8 and skills for any subject, the board shall determine whether
- 9 issuance of a proclamation is necessary based on the significance
- 10 of the changes to the essential knowledge and skills. If the board
- 11 determines a proclamation is necessary, the board shall issue:
- 12 (1) a full call for instructional materials aligned to
- 13 all of the essential knowledge and skills for the subject and grade
- 14 level;
- 15 (2) a supplemental call for instructional materials
- 16 aligned to new or expanded essential knowledge and skills for the
- 17 subject and grade level;
- 18 (3) a call for new information demonstrating alignment
- 19 of current instructional materials to the revised essential
- 20 knowledge and skills; or
- 21 (4) any combination of the calls described by
- 22 <u>Subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).</u>
- 23 (b-3) In determining the disbursement of money to the
- 24 available school fund and the amount of that disbursement that will
- 25 be used, in accordance with Section 43.001(d), to fund the
- 26 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, the board
- 27 must consider the cost of all instructional materials and

- 1 technology requirements for that state fiscal biennium.
- 2 (f) The board shall amend any proclamation [request for
- 3 production] issued for the purchase of instructional materials to
- 4 conform to the instructional materials funding levels provided by
- 5 the General Appropriations Act for the year of implementation and
- 6 to comply with Subsection (b-1).
- 7 SECTION 7. Section 43.001(d), Education Code, is amended to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (d) Each biennium [year] the State Board of Education shall
- 10 set aside an amount equal to 50 percent of the [annual] distribution
- 11 for that biennium [year] from the permanent school fund to the
- 12 available school fund as provided by Section 5(a), Article VII,
- 13 Texas Constitution, to be placed, subject to the General
- 14 Appropriations Act, in the state instructional materials fund
- 15 established under Section 31.021.
- SECTION 8. Section 403.093(d), Government Code, is amended
- 17 to read as follows:
- 18 (d) The comptroller shall transfer from the general revenue
- 19 fund to the foundation school fund an amount of money necessary to
- 20 fund the foundation school program as provided by Chapter 42,
- 21 Education Code. The comptroller shall make the transfers in
- 22 installments as necessary to comply with Section 42.259, Education
- 23 Code, and permit the Texas Education Agency, to the extent
- 24 authorized by the General Appropriations Act, to make temporary
- 25 transfers from the foundation school fund for payment of the
- 26 instructional materials allotment under Section 31.0211, Education
- 27 Code. Unless an earlier date is necessary for purposes of temporary

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- 1 transfers for payment of the instructional materials allotment, an
- 2 [An] installment must be made not earlier than two days before the
- 3 date an installment to school districts is required by Section
- 4 42.259, Education Code, and must not exceed the amount necessary
- 5 for that payment and any temporary transfers for payment of the
- 6 <u>instructional materials allotment</u>.
- 7 SECTION 9. Sections 31.101(d) and (e), Education Code, are
- 8 repealed.
- 9 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
