6	follows: ACCESS TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION: EMPLOYMENT
7	BY MUNICIPALITY. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b), a
8	municipality is entitled to obtain from the department criminal
9	history record information maintained by the department that
10	relates to a person who is: an applicant for employment by the
11	municipality.
12	(1) an applicant for employment with the municipality;
13	(2) an employee of the municipality;
14	(3) an applicant for employment with or an employee of
15	a business or person that contracts with the municipality;
16	(4) a volunteer with the municipality; or
17	(5) a volunteer applicant to the municipality.
18	Not later than September 1, 2000, the department shall make
19	available through electronic means the information available to
20	municipalities under this section.

- 1 Subsection (b), a county is entitled to obtain from the department
- 2 criminal history record information maintained by the department
- 3 that relates to a person who is: an applicant for employment by the
- 4 county.
- 5 <u>(1)</u> an applicant for employment with the county;
- 6 <u>(2)</u> an employee of the county;
- 7 <u>(3)</u> an applicant for employment with or an employee of
- 8 <u>a business or person that contracts with the county;</u>
- 9 <u>(4)</u> a volunteer with the county; or
- 10 (5) a volunteer applicant to the county.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
