H.B. No. 2859

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the establishment of membership service credit by a member of the Employees Retirement System of Texas for employment 3 with a tribal government. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 6 SECTION 1. Section 811.001(16), Government Code, is amended to read as follows: 7 (16) "Service credit" means the amount of membership 8 9 and tribal government or military service ascribed to a person's account in the retirement system for which all required 10 contributions have been made to, and are being held by, the 11 12 retirement system. SECTION 2. Section 813.001, Government Code, is amended to 13 14 read as follows: Sec. 813.001. TYPES OF CREDITABLE SERVICE. 15 The types of 16 service creditable in the retirement system are membership service, tribal government service, military service, and equivalent 17 membership service. 18 SECTION 3. Section 813.101, Government Code, is amended to 19 20 read as follows: 21 Sec. 813.101. DETERMINATION OF REQUIRED DEPOSITS. The 22 retirement system shall determine in each case the amount of money 23 to be deposited by a member claiming credit for membership, tribal government service, or military service previously canceled or not 24

1 previously established. The system may not provide benefits based 2 on the claimed service until the determined amount has been fully 3 paid.

4 SECTION 4. Section 813.106, Government Code, is amended to 5 read as follows:

Sec. 813.106. SERVICE NOT PREVIOUSLY ESTABLISHED. 6 The 7 state shall make contributions for service not previously 8 established that is established under Section 813.104 in the amount provided by Section 813.202(c) for membership service, [or] the 9 amount provided by Section 813.302(d) for military service, or the 10 amount provided by Section 813.602(b) for tribal government 11 12 service, as applicable. The state contributions will be made at the time the service credit is granted. 13

14 SECTION 5. Section 813.401, Government Code, is amended to 15 read as follows:

Sec. 813.401. SERVICE CREDITABLE IN ELECTED CLASS. Service
creditable in the elected class of membership is:

18 (1) membership service in an office included in that 19 class;

20 (2) military service established as provided by
 21 Subchapter D; [and]

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(3) tribal government service established as provided by Subchapter G; and

24 (4) equivalent membership service specifically made
 25 creditable in that class.

26 SECTION 6. Section 813.404, Government Code, is amended to 27 read as follows:

1 Sec. 813.404. CONTRIBUTIONS FOR SERVICE NOT PREVIOUSLY 2 ESTABLISHED. For each month of membership, military, <u>tribal</u> 3 <u>government</u>, or equivalent membership service not previously 4 credited in the retirement system, a member claiming credit in the 5 elected class shall pay a contribution in an amount equal to the 6 greater of:

7 (1) eight percent of the monthly salary paid to
8 members of the legislature at the time the credit is established; or
9 (2) the appropriate member contribution provided by
10 Section 815.402 for a person who holds, at the time the credit is
11 established, the office for which credit is sought.

SECTION 7. Section 813.501, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 813.501. SERVICE CREDITABLE IN EMPLOYEE CLASS.
Service creditable in the employee class of membership is:

16 (1) membership service in a position included in that 17 class;

18 (2) military service established as provided by19 Subchapter D;

20 (3) service creditable in or transferred from the
21 elected class as provided by Section 813.503; [and]

(4) administrative board service established as
provided by Section 813.502; and

24 (5) tribal government service established as provided
 25 by Subchapter G.
 26 SECTION 8. Section 813.503(a), Government Code, is amended

27 to read as follows:

(a) A member may establish in, or have transferred to, the 1 employee class all service credited in the elected class, if the 2 contributions made to establish the service in the elected class 3 equal or exceed contributions required of a member of the employee 4 5 class for the same amount of service during the same time and at the same rate of compensation. A member or retiree who has, or had at 6 the time of retirement, at least eight years of service credit in 7 8 the elected class of membership, exclusive of tribal government or military service, may transfer service credit between classes 9 before or after retirement. 10

SECTION 9. Section 813.505(a), Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) A member claiming credit in the employee class for
membership service not previously established, including a member
<u>claiming credit in the employee class for tribal government</u>
<u>service</u>, shall, for each month of the service, pay a contribution in
an amount equal to the greater of:

(1) the appropriate member contribution provided by
Section 815.402 for the service during the time for which credit is
sought; or

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(2) \$18.

22 SECTION 10. Chapter 813, Government Code, is amended by 23 adding Subchapter G to read as follows:

<u>SUBCHAPTER G. ESTABLISHMENT OF TRIBAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE</u>
 <u>Sec. 813.601. CREDITABLE TRIBAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE. (a) A</u>
 member may establish membership service credit for employment with
 a tribal government in accordance with this subchapter.

1 (b) A member may establish one month of service credit for 2 each month or fraction of a month of employment with a tribal 3 government, but not more than 60 months of service credit in the 4 retirement system for tribal government service.

Sec. 813.602. TRIBAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE NOT PREVIOUSLY 5 ESTABLISHED. (a) A member may establish service credit under 6 7 Section 813.603 by depositing with the retirement system in a lump sum a contribution computed as provided by Section 813.404 or 8 813.505, as applicable, plus, if the member does not establish the 9 credit before the first anniversary of the date of first 10 eligibility, interest computed on the basis of the state fiscal 11 year at an annual rate of 10 percent from the date of first 12 eligibility to the date of deposit. 13

14 (b) The state shall contribute for service established 15 under this section an amount in the same ratio to the member's contribution for the service as the state's contribution bears to 16 17 the contribution for current service required of a member of the employee class at the time the service is established under this 18 19 section. The state's contribution shall be paid from the fund from which the member receives compensation at the time the service is 20 established or, if the member does not hold a position at the time 21 the service is established, from the fund from which the member 22 received compensation when the member most recently held a 23 24 position.

(c) The board of trustees may require members applying for
 credit under this section to submit any information the board finds
 necessary to enable it to determine eligibility for or amount of

1 service or amounts of required contributions. 2 Sec. 813.603. SERVICE CREDITED TO MEMBERSHIP CLASS. Tribal government service is creditable in a class of membership that 3 includes a position held by the member at the time the member 4 5 establishes service credit. Sec. 813.604. USE OF TRIBAL GOVERNMENT SERVICE CREDIT. (a) 6 7 The retirement system shall use service credit established under this subchapter in computing occupational disability retirement 8 benefits and death benefits and in determining eligibility to 9 10 select an optional death benefit plan. (b) The retirement system shall use service credit 11 12 established under this subchapter in computing service retirement or nonoccupational disability retirement benefits of a member of 13 the employee class only if the member has, without service credit 14 established under this subchapter, at least five years of service 15 16 credit in that class. 17 (c) The retirement system shall use service credit established under this subchapter in computing service retirement 18 19 or nonoccupational disability retirement benefits of a member of the elected class only if the member has enough service credit, 20 exclusive of the service credit established under this subchapter, 21 to be eligible for service retirement benefits at age 60. 22 23 SECTION 11. Section 815.311(a), Government Code, is amended 24 to read as follows: The retirement system shall deposit in a member's 25 (a) 26 individual account in the employees saving account the following

27 amounts:

1 (1)the amount of contributions to the retirement 2 system that is deducted from the member's compensation; 3 (2) the portion of a deposit required to reinstate service credit previously canceled that represents only the amount 4 5 withdrawn; 6 (3) the portion of a deposit required to establish 7 service credit not previously established that represents only the 8 required contribution; [and] 9 the portion of a deposit required to establish (4) 10 military service credit that represents only the member's contribution for that credit; and 11 (5) the portion of a deposit required to establish 12 tribal government service credit that represents only the member's 13 14 contribution for that credit. 15 SECTION 12. Section 815.312(b), Government Code, is amended 16 to read as follows: 17 (b) The retirement system also shall deposit in the state accumulation account the interest portion of the following deposits 18 19 made by members: 20 deposits required to reinstate service previously (1)canceled; 21 (2) deposits required to establish service credit not 22 23 previously established; [and] 24 (3) deposits required to establish military service 25 credit; and 26 (4) deposits required to establish tribal government 27 service credit.

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1 SECTION 13. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
