## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

read as follows:

2 relating to state-supported education and health care benefits for

- 3 certain military personnel and their dependents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.341(a), Education Code, is amended to
- 7 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 8 education shall exempt the following persons from the payment of
- 9 tuition, dues, fees, and other required charges, including fees for
- 10 correspondence courses but excluding general deposit fees, student
- 11 services fees, and any fees or charges for lodging, board, or
- 12 clothing, provided the person seeking the exemption currently
- 13 resides in this state and has established a domicile, as defined by
- 14 Section 54.0501, in this state [entered the service at a location in
- 15 this state, declared this state as the person's home of record in
- 16 the manner provided by the applicable military or other service, or
- 17 would have been determined to be a resident of this state for
- 18 purposes of Subchapter B at the time the person entered the
- 19 service]:
- 20 (1) all nurses and honorably discharged members of the
- 21 armed forces of the United States who served during the
- 22 Spanish-American War or during World War I;
- 23 (2) all nurses, members of the Women's Army Auxiliary
- 24 Corps, members of the Women's Auxiliary Volunteer Emergency

- 1 Service, and all honorably discharged members of the armed forces
- 2 of the United States who served during World War II except those who
- 3 were discharged from service because they were over the age of 38 or
- 4 because of a personal request on the part of the person that the
- 5 person be discharged from service;
- 6 (3) all honorably discharged men and women of the
- 7 armed forces of the United States who served during the national
- 8 emergency which began on June 27, 1950, and which is referred to as
- 9 the Korean War; and
- 10 (4) all persons who were honorably discharged from the
- 11 armed forces of the United States after serving on active military
- 12 duty, excluding training, for more than 180 days and who served a
- 13 portion of their active duty during:
- 14 (A) the Cold War which began on the date of the
- 15 termination of the national emergency cited in Subdivision (3);
- 16 (B) the Vietnam era which began on December 21,
- 17 1961, and ended on May 7, 1975;
- 18 (C) the Grenada and Lebanon era which began on
- 19 August 24, 1982, and ended on July 31, 1984;
- (D) the Panama era which began on December 20,
- 21 1989, and ended on January 21, 1990;
- (E) the Persian Gulf War which began on August 2,
- 23 1990, and ends on the date thereafter prescribed by Presidential
- 24 proclamation or September 1, 1997, whichever occurs first;
- 25 (F) the national emergency by reason of certain
- 26 terrorist attacks that began on September 11, 2001; or
- (G) any future national emergency declared in

- 1 accordance with federal law.
- 2 SECTION 2. Subchapter A, Chapter 434, Government Code, is
- 3 amended by adding Section 434.0191 to read as follows:
- 4 Sec. 434.0191. FREE HEALTH CARE SERVICES FOR VETERANS AND
- 5 DEPENDENTS. The Texas Veterans Commission, in cooperation with the
- 6 Health and Human Services Commission and the board of regents of The
- 7 University of Texas System, shall ensure that a person who is
- 8 eligible for an exemption from tuition and fees under Section
- 9 51.341(a), (a-2), or (b) and who resides in the Rio Grande Valley
- 10 region of this state is eligible to receive health care services at
- 11 no cost at a simulation teaching hospital in the Rio Grande Valley
- 12 associated with The University of Texas System.
- SECTION 3. The changes in law made by this Act to Section
- 14 54.341(a), Education Code, apply beginning with tuition and fees
- 15 charged for the 2015 fall semester. Tuition and fees charged for a
- 16 term or semester before the 2015 fall semester are governed by the
- 17 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 18 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 19 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
