## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a study of the use of a patient-reported outcomes 3 registry in conjunction with health coverage for certain 4 governmental employees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

6 SECTION 1. STUDY; PATIENT-REPORTED OUTCOMES REGISTRIES FOR CERTAIN CARE. The Teacher Retirement System of Texas and the 7 Employees Retirement System of Texas shall jointly conduct a study 8 benefits 9 of the and disadvantages of establishing а patient-reported outcomes registry for musculoskeletal care 10 provided under the plans of group coverage administered by the 11 12 systems under Chapters 1551, 1575, and 1579, Insurance Code. The study conducted under this section must: 13

14 (1) identify the musculoskeletal conditions and 15 injuries that result in the highest cost for health care in the 16 plans of group coverage;

17 (2) identify the percentage of the total cost for 18 health care under the plans of group coverage that is spent for the 19 conditions and injuries described by Subdivision (1) of this 20 section;

(3) estimate the cost for the systems, or for the entities administering the plans of group coverage on the systems' behalf, to establish and administer a patient-reported outcomes registry for musculoskeletal care;

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1 (4) evaluate the potential benefits of a 2 patient-reported outcomes registry for musculoskeletal care for 3 the populations served by the plans of group coverage; and

4 (5) identify potential partners, such as medical 5 schools located in this state, that could assist the systems in 6 establishing and administering a patient-reported outcomes 7 registry for musculoskeletal care.

8 SECTION 2. REPORT. Not later than December 1, 2016, the 9 Teacher Retirement System of Texas and the Employees Retirement 10 System of Texas shall report the results of the study conducted 11 under Section 1 of this Act to the speaker of the house of 12 representatives, the lieutenant governor, and the standing 13 committees of the house and the senate with jurisdiction over the 14 retirement systems and insurance. The report must:

15 (1) specify whether establishing one or more 16 patient-reported outcomes registries for musculoskeletal care 17 would be beneficial and effective; and

18 (2) be accompanied by recommendations for19 legislation, if appropriate.

20 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION. Sections 1 and 2 of this Act and this 21 section expire September 1, 2017.

22 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect September 23 1,2015.

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
