## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2	relating	to	the	Task	Force	on	Infectious	Disease	Preparedness	and

- 2 relating to the Task Force on Infectious Disease Preparedness and 3 Response.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 81, Health and Safety Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subchapter J to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER J. TASK FORCE ON INFECTIOUS DISEASE PREPAREDNESS AND
- 8 RESPONSE
- 9 Sec. 81.401. DEFINITION. In this subchapter, "task force"
- 10 means the Task Force on Infectious Disease Preparedness and
- 11 Response.

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- Sec. 81.402. TASK FORCE; DUTIES. (a) The Task Force on
- 13 <u>Infectious Disease Preparedness and Response is created as an</u>
- 14 advisory board to the governor.
- 15 (b) The task force shall:
- 16 (1) provide expert, evidence-based assessments,
- 17 protocols, and recommendations related to state responses to
- 18 infectious diseases, including Ebola, and a strategic emergency
- 19 management plan for state and local levels of government;
- 20 (2) develop a comprehensive plan to ensure that Texas
- 21 is prepared for the potential of widespread outbreak of infectious
- 22 diseases, such as the Ebola virus, and can provide rapid response
- 23 that effectively protects the safety and well-being of citizens of
- 24 this state;

- 1 (3) evaluate the supplies and resources available to 2 address an infectious disease outbreak; and
- 2 address all fillections disease outbreak; and
- 3 <u>(4) serve as a reliable and transparent source of</u>
- 4 information and education for Texas leadership and citizens.
- 5 (c) In developing the plan described by Subsection (b)(2),
- 6 the task force shall:
- 7 (1) use the significant expertise of medical
- 8 professionals in Texas and other states;
- 9 (2) collaborate with local government officials and
- 10 <u>local health officials;</u>
- 11 (3) use, as practicable, the Texas Emergency
- 12 Preparedness Plan and structure;
- 13 (4) identify various responses necessary in the event
- 14 of an epidemic of infectious disease;
- 15 (5) establish a command and control structure that
- 16 will ensure effective preparations and response if the governor
- 17 takes emergency action under Chapter 418, Government Code, or other
- 18 law; and
- 19 (6) coordinate with appropriate entities to ensure
- 20 public awareness and education regarding any pandemic threat.
- 21 Sec. 81.403. APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS; TERMS. (a) The
- 22 governor may appoint members of the task force as necessary,
- 23 including members from relevant state agencies, members with
- 24 expertise in infectious diseases and other issues involved in the
- 25 prevention of the spread of infectious diseases, and members from
- 26 institutions of higher education in this state.
- 27 (b) The governor shall appoint a director of the task force

- 1 from among the members of the task force.
- 2 (c) The governor may fill any vacancy that occurs on the
- 3 task force and may appoint additional members as needed.
- 4 (d) Members of the task force serve at the pleasure of the
- 5 governor.
- 6 (e) A state or local employee appointed to the task force
- 7 shall perform any duties required by the task force in addition to
- 8 the regular duties of the employee.
- 9 Sec. 81.404. REPORTS. (a) The task force shall report to
- 10 the governor, legislature, Texas Medical Board, and any relevant
- 11 medical associations as often as necessary to make recommendations
- 12 for updating protocols for addressing infectious diseases.
- 13 (b) The task force shall make written reports on its
- 14 findings and recommendations, including legislative
- 15 recommendations, to the governor and legislature on December 1 of
- 16 <u>each even-numbered year.</u>
- Sec. 81.405. MEETINGS. (a) The task force shall meet at
- 18 times and locations as determined by the director of the task force.
- 19 (b) The task force may meet telephonically.
- 20 (c) The task force may hold public hearings to gather
- 21 information. The task force shall endeavor to meet in various parts
- 22 of the state to encourage local input.
- 23 (d) The task force may meet in executive session to discuss
- 24 matters that are confidential by state or federal law or to ensure
- 25 public security or law enforcement needs.
- Sec. 81.406. ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. State agencies with
- 27 members on the task force shall provide administrative support for

- 1 the task force.
- 2 Sec. 81.407. REIMBURSEMENT. Task force members serve
- 3 without compensation and are not entitled to reimbursement for
- 4 travel expenses.
- 5 SECTION 2. On the effective date of this Act, a member
- 6 serving on the Task Force on Infectious Disease Preparedness and
- 7 Response created by executive order of the governor continues to
- 8 serve on the Task Force on Infectious Disease Preparedness and
- 9 Response under Subchapter J, Chapter 81, Health and Safety Code, as
- 10 added by this Act.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
