2	relating to the preservation of the Alamo complex and surrounding
3	area and to the Alamo Preservation Advisory Board.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter I, Chapter 31, Natural Resources
6	Code, is amended by adding Section 31.450 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 31.450. FINDINGS; MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. (a)
8	The legislature finds that:
9	(1) the Alamo has played an important role in the
10	history of this state and continues to be a symbol of liberty and
11	freedom for this state;
12	(2) this state wants to honor the individuals whose
13	lives were lost at the Alamo;
14	(3) the entire history of the Alamo, from the time the
15	Alamo was established as a mission until the present, should be
16	recognized; and
17	(4) the Alamo is a world-class destination that
18	provides a place of remembrance and education.
19	(b) The land office shall enter into a memorandum of
20	understanding with the City of San Antonio to coordinate the
21	planning and development of improvements to the Alamo complex and
22	the area immediately surrounding the complex.
23	SECTION 2. Sections 31.455(a) and (b), Natural Resources
24	Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The land office may establish an Alamo Preservation
 Advisory Board to provide advice, proposals, and recommendations
 to:

4 (1) promote the development of a world-class site to
5 educate visitors on the history and importance of the Alamo in this
6 state's fight for independence and to honor the people who lost
7 their lives at the Alamo;

(2) promote and support the Alamo complex;

9 (3) [(2)] provide the resources and support necessary 10 to advance the understanding and education of current and future 11 generations on the historical significance and factual record of 12 the Alamo complex;

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(4) [(3)] inspire virtues of honor and Texas pride;

14 (5) [(4)] preserve the memory and achievement of 15 individuals who served at the Alamo and provide a fitting tribute to 16 the heroism of the people who paid the ultimate sacrifice for 17 freedom and of the noble men and women of this state who have served 18 in the armed forces or died while serving in the armed forces to 19 ensure the freedom of the people of this state;

20 <u>(6) provide educational and museum facilities</u> [(5) 21 promote and provide] for the preservation, perpetuation, 22 appropriate publication, and display of manuscripts, books, 23 relics, pictures, oral histories, and all other items and 24 information related to the history of the Alamo complex and of this 25 state that preserve the historical character of the Alamo shrine; 26 and

(7) [(6)] promote, counsel, and provide support to

No. 2968 governmental and private organizations that are committed to 1 2 objectives similar to the objectives described in this subsection. 3 (b) The advisory board is composed of: 4 (1) the commissioner or the commissioner's designee, 5 who serves as the presiding officer of the advisory board; 6 (2) a designee appointed by the governor; 7 (3) a representative of the Alamo Endowment, appointed 8 by the commissioner [the president general of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas]; 9 [current Alamo 10 (4) the director of the Alamo chairperson of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas]; 11 [the immediate past Alamo chairperson of the 12 (5) Daughters of the Republic of Texas; 13 14 [(6)] the Alamo curator; 15 (6) [(7)] one representative of the Texas Historical 16 Commission; 17 (7) a designee appointed by the county judge of [(8) the president of the] Bexar County [Historical Commission]; 18 [and] 19 20 (8) a designee appointed by the mayor [(9) one representative who serves as a member] of the City of San Antonio; 21 22 [Office of Historic Preservation] 23 (9) a designee appointed by the commissioner 24 representing the local travel and tourism industry and the businesses and landholders from the area immediately surrounding 25 26 the Alamo complex; 27 (10) one member of the house of representatives

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appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; and (11) one senator appointed by the lieutenant governor.

3 SECTION 3. (a) The term of a member serving on the Alamo 4 Preservation Advisory Board immediately before the effective date 5 of this Act whose position on the board is abolished by the changes 6 in law made by this Act expires on the effective date of this Act.

7 (b) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this 8 Act, each appointing official shall appoint members to the Alamo 9 Preservation Advisory Board as required by Section 31.455, Natural 10 Resources Code, as amended by this Act.

(c) As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the General Land Office shall enter into a memorandum of understanding with the City of San Antonio as required by Section 31.450(b), Natural Resources Code, as added by this Act.

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SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2015.
